Year 1 Weekly Information w/b 22.5.17

In English this week we are continuing with the 'Lighthouse Keeper' stories and the children will be focusing on adding description to their writing and writing their own versions of the story. Whilst in Maths we will reviewing the learning from this half term.

This week will also be this half term's spelling test. These 20 words are the hardest of the 100 High Frequency words, so your child may find it tricky this time. Next half term the spelling homework will be to review all 100 words, meaning that there is plenty more time to practice the ones that your child hasn't quite got yet!

In speedy maths the focus this week will be on adding 2 to a number (eg $35 + 2 =$); these can also be described as "two more than" and will also include the addition facts for pairs of numbers that total 20 (eg $14+6 =$).

On Thursday all three classes will be having Show and Tell time. As ever, please ensure that any items coming into school are clearly name labelled. We have discouraged the children from bringing anything too precious or expensive, and toys are not allowed as part of Show and Tell.

Thank you for all of the returned Golden Books. Remember that they need to be returned as they are kept at school.

The children will be taking part in an art workshop after half term please could they have:

- Margarine or takeaway tub each
- Odds and ends no larger than a clothes peg that they could press into clay e.g. broken Lego characters, items from party bags no longer played with, bits of broken toys from the bottom of the toybox!

Please bring this in week commencing Monday 5 June as the workshop will be taking place for some during the first week back.

We are hoping that the weather continues to be good for sports day on Friday. Don't forget that your child will need a packed lunch (school dinner children will be provided with a packed lunch), a hat and a water bottle. As always during sunny weather, please apply sunscreen to your child before school. The cloakrooms will be cleared on Thursday, with PE kits being sent home. Children should wear their PE kit to school on Friday and will not need their book bag.

Year 2 Weekly Information w/b 22.5.17

We hope that you have safely received your child's Golden book and that you've enjoyed seeing what they've been getting up to at school! Please can we kindly ask to have all Golden Books back at school before Friday, so that we can keep them safe ready to hand up to your child's Year 3 teachers.

In English this week, we will be learning about non-chronological reports. The children will learn that these are examples of non-fiction writing and can be found in many information books. They will learn about the features of a non-chronological report and will, as a class, contribute to writing a report about dogs by the end of the week. We will also be having our half termly test on the Y2 Spelling list this week, so please ensure Learning Journals are in school every day.

In maths we will be solving mini reasoning tasks across a range of different areas of maths that we have covered this year so far. We will be doing these during morning task time each morning – who will get to the end of their booklet by Friday?

Coming up soon in Speedy Maths (* indicates new learning):

w/b 22.5.17	*Count in $\frac{1}{4}$ s to 10 Know number facts to 20 (ml) Know one more and one less including 3-digit numbers. Double numbers to 20. Know 2x, 5x, 10x tables and division facts.
w/b 5.6.17	*Add 10 to any number Know one more and one less including 3-digit numbers. Know division facts for 2x, 5x, 10x tables. Know number bonds to 20 Add 1-digit to 2-digits at speed.

A reminder that Year 2 have a mufti day tomorrow (Tuesday 23 May) resulting from their excellent negotiations with Mrs Druce on Pirate Day! The children may wear their own clothes to school on this day.

Editor's/Mrs Druce's Note: I would disagree that the negotiations were excellent as they didn't get their first two options!!!

On Thursday, the children will come home with their PE kits ready for Sports Day on Friday. They should come to school wearing their PE kit and trainers. Year 3 Weekly Information w/b 22.5.17

In English, the children will be working on using connectives correctly in their writing. They are going to practise editing work to include better connective choices and then write their own pieces that make good use of connectives later in the week.

In maths this week, the children will be thinking about 3D shapes. At the beginning of the week we are going to be practising naming 3D shapes and giving information about their properties e.g. faces, edges and vertices. We are also going to be making our own 3D shapes using art straws and exploring how many different ways you can make a net for a cube.

Coming up soon in Speedy Maths:

w/b 22.5.17	To say 100 more than numbers to 3-digit. Subtract tens from 3-digit numbers at speed. Know pairs of numbers to 100. Know 2x, 3x, 4x, 5x, 6x, 10x tables and division facts.
w/b 5.6.17	To say 100 less than numbers to 3-digit. To say 100 more than numbers to 3-digit. Know 2x, 3x, 4x, 5x, 6x, 10x tables and division facts. Know pairs of numbers to 20.

In our themed lessons this week, we will begin learning about aspects of Tudor life. As part of this, the children will learn about Tudor clothing and will be comparing those of rich Tudors and poor Tudors as well as comparing clothing from the Tudor period with those from a different period in history. The children are also going to be using the iPads to create books about Francis Drake.

On Friday it is Sports Day – we look forward to seeing those of you who can make it.

Year 4 Weekly Information w/b 22.5.17

We're very excited about Sports Day on Friday. Don't forget that on Friday the children need to arrive at school in PE kit with a hat, a water bottle and having applied sun screen.

We will be introducing our new 'Survival' theme this week. If anyone has a fire lighting flint that we could borrow (in the first week back after half term) to teach the children fire lighting skills, please could you give it to Miss Jenkins or Mrs Spooner.

In English we will be looking at how leaflets are written and using these skills to write our own Survival leaflets.

This week in maths we will be going over our summary of learning and revising some of the topics where mistakes were commonly made. This includes work on area, addition and subtraction word problems, counting in tenths, hundredths and thousandths and balancing simple equations.

Coming up in speedy maths (* indicates new learning):

w/b 22.5.17	*Know division facts for 12x table at speed. Add and subtract pairs of 2-digit numbers at speed.
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	Know pairs of tens to 180 Add three tens at speed.
w/b 5.6.17	Give change from £1 at speed Use tables facts to work out related x at speed.

In music this week we are learning how to describe music with vocabulary such as duration, timbre, pitch, beat and tempo. In computing we will be working with an app called nearpod as part of our survival theme.

Year 5 Weekly Information w/b 22.5.17

We have another busy and exciting week this week!

In English the children will be looking at grammar and what an expanded noun is and when it is best used. They will also be recapping clauses in sentences and relative pronouns. In maths children will continue to learn about percentages. They will be learning about the relationship between fractions, decimals and percentages. They will then be applying this knowledge to problem solving.

w.b 22.05.17	Add and subtract pairs of 2-digit numbers at speed. Know pairs of numbers to 100. Use tables to work out related x and ÷ at speed. Continue simple number patterns
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For our themed lessons the children will be learning the importance of 'a vote' and why people who can, should vote.

On Tuesday we will be watching the Drama club dress rehearsal and in the afternoon we will be welcoming students from Rosebery who will be running a French session for the whole of Y5 so thank you Mrs Cater 😊
