Snapchat Advice for parents



Snapchat has introduced a new tracker in its update where you can view the exact location of your friends. Unfortunately, this means that by posting photos, children will now automatically be revealing their area, town, street and potentially even house.

Children must ensure that they have their location set to **ghost mode** so that no one can see where they are.

To do this:

- 1) Make sure the app is the updated version and go to selfie mode on the camera.
- 2) Zoom out. This will give you the option of changing who can see your location.

We know some of our older children use this app and so have provided this warning, but please do not take this message as an indication that we encourage the use of this app. The following NSPCC advice remains valid:

Year 1 Weekly Information w/b 26.6.17

In English this week we will be focussing on information writing. We will be linking English to science and writing about animals and plants that are common in Britain. We will also be learning about the different parts of plants and what they are called.

In maths this week we will be rehearsing some of the main mathematical concepts we have learnt. We will be focusing on addition, subtraction and mental maths in a variety of contexts using real life situations.

A little pre-warning: Next week we will be having an exciting time learning about capacity with lots of water activities. We will be asking children to bring in some clothes that can get wet (i.e. t-shirt and shorts), a small towel and flip flops/crocs/old shoes or similar as they will be dealing with lots of water. At the moment we have planned this day for Monday so please bring these items in or Monday. Obviously this is weather permitting so it may be any day next week.

A big thank you to the parents who have volunteered to help us on our trip to the British Wildlife Centre on Wednesday 5 July. It will be an exciting day - let's hope its sunny!

Finally, this is Mr Woollard's final week with 1W. We would like to say a huge thank you to him for all his hard work – all of the children in Year 1 have enjoyed getting to know him and will miss his calm, friendly approach. His final day will be Thursday. We would like to wish him lots of luck for the future and with his new job; he will be an asset to the teaching profession.

Year 2 Weekly Information w/b 26.6.17

In English this week, we will be finishing off our learning about the stories of Beatrix Potter. The children will hear the stories of Squirrel Nutkin and Mrs Tiggy Winkle and will practise writing different sentence types about these stories. At the end of the week, the children will be coming up with their own adventure for one of the Beatrix Potter characters.

In maths, we will be focussing on measures and shape. The children will be finding different ways of making the same amount of money, measuring accurately, telling the time and looking at edges on 3D shapes. If your child doesn't already have one, it would help them if they had an analogue watch or teaching clock that you can mount on the wall which is frequently referred to in order to help your child get to grips with telling the time.

In theme this week, we will be exploring under the sea. We will have a small geography focus where we will look at geographical similarities and differences of human and physical features. We will also be using the iPads to research about marine life.

Year 3 Weekly Information w/b 26.6.17

In English this week, the children are going to work on an Olympic poem. They will be using photographs from London 2012 to generate their own descriptive sentences about the Olympics. Later in the week the children are going to organise those ideas into a shape poem.

In maths this week, we are going to be looking at some Olympic data and creating bar graphs of different information. We are also going to be doing some revision of written calculation methods.

Coming up soon in speedy maths:

w/b 26.6.17	Double and half tens at speed. Know 2x, 3x, 4x, 5x, 6x, 10x tables and division facts. Mentally add and subtract pairs of 2-digit numbers. Add units to 3-digit numbers at speed.
w/b 3.7.17	Know 2x, 3x, 4x, 5x, 6x, 10x tables and division facts. Double and half tens at speed. Add and subtract pairs of 2-digit numbers.

After many weeks of preparation, the Summer Fun Day is nearly here. On Saturday 8.7.17 the children will be performing their dancing at 2.00pm until approximately 2.10pm. They are very much looking forward to showing off all their hard work. Please ensure you arrange a meeting point with your child after they have performed. They will lead off from the playground before being dismissed to go and find their parents. Please can the children meet us by the Studio at 1.45pm. Year 4 Weekly Information w/b 26.6.17

We hope you all enjoyed the sunshine last week. Many thanks to those of you who have already sent in empty tubes such as kitchen rolls. We are still collecting as we ideally need one for every child so please continue to bring them in - no toilet rolls please!

In maths this week we are focusing on understanding different units of measurement and converting from one to another (ml to l, kg to g, mm to cm, cm to m and m to km). If you have a chance to discuss these with your child when cooking or walking to and from school that would be great as this is often quite a tricky topic.

In English the children will be using an iPad app called Book Creator to create a non-fiction book all about digestion. The children will be using their computing research skills to gather necessary information.

Coming up in speedy maths (* indicates new learning):

w/b 26.6.17	*Know all tables to 12x12 including division facts at speed. Know pairs of numbers to 100. Add 3 1-digit numbers at speed. Use tables facts to work out related x at speed.
w/b 3.7.17	Know all tables to 12x12 including division facts at speed. Know pairs of tens to 180 Add and subtract pairs of 2-digit numbers at speed. Know pairs of numbers to 90

In our themed learning, we will be recognising that living things can be grouped in a variety of ways. We will learn how to use a classification key and develop this skill to create our own to categorise animals. We will also be creating our own food chains and looking at the relationship between producers and consumers. In music we will be learning about the different notes used in music, focusing on crotchets, quavers, rests, minims and semibreves.

In addition this week we will be writing our Year 4 assembly about High Ashurst. We hope to see as many of you as possible on Friday 7 July.

Year 5 Weekly Information w/b 26.6.17

In English this week the children will be finishing their reviews and editing and improving them using peer assessment. They will also be practising their reading comprehension skills and revising some grammar and punctuation work. On Friday the children will be having an assessment on all the Year 5 spelling words, which they have been learning each week.

In maths the children will be undertaking investigations requiring logical thought and will also be explaining their reasoning and how they solved the problem. Later in the week they will be using measures - estimating volume and capacity.

Throughout the week children will be working on a maths project where they will be exploring tessellation and creating their own tessellating pattern.

Year 6 Weekly Information w/b 26.6.17

We hope the children have had a chance to rest over the weekend following our week at PGL. They were all amazing and it was a pleasure to spend time with them.

This week we will be reflecting on our PGL adventures and writing up our memories, both from the activities and the cabins. We will be using these memories to create short sketches later in the week.

In science, we will be looking at the digestive system and how the body absorbs nutrients. This looks at the path our food takes once it enters the mouth and every stage through the system.

Rosebery's Year 9 drama students will be visiting us again this week to run a workshop about transition. The first part of this workshop took place last month.
