Year 2 Weekly Information w/b 9.7.18

In English lessons this week, we will be finishing off our learning about the stories of Beatrix Potter. The children will hear the stories of Squirrel Nutkin and will be practising using different sentence types. At the end of the week, the children will be coming up with their own adventure for one of the Beatrix Potter characters in groups and performing these to the class.

In maths we will be applying our knowledge of money and calculating using the 4 operations through an open-ended problem solving task. The children will have to consider how to approach solving the problem in their quest to try to find a solution. It will be interesting to see the children's different ideas and approaches as the week progresses!

The Year 2's are very excited at the prospect of joining Y3 and Y4 in becoming 'Times tables Rockstars'! This is an app which allows children to become more proficient in their times tables knowledge and gets them to improve their speed and accuracy over time. Last week, the children set up their accounts so that they could use the Times Tables Rock Stars website (www.ttrockstars.com) and app. The app can be downloaded for free from your network provider's app store or equivalent. As well as beginning to use the app at school over the next couple of weeks, the children can use their accounts at home to practise over the summer holidays (using garage mode only, being tested on tables that have been set by the teachers) and then continue into Year 3 and beyond. Please could we ask that brothers and sisters (and mums and dads) don't use the children's accounts and play on their behalf as the class teachers are tracking their progress and using this information to feed into the learning happening in class. Thanks for your support with this!

Year 3 Weekly Information w/b 9.7.18

In English this week, the children will be working on their story writing, inspired by the book 'Journey' by Aaron Becker. The whole of the story is told using only pictures. We will be studying characters and thinking about telling our own stories using skills we have learnt throughout the year.

In maths, the children will be tackling some maths investigations that involve data handling and time.

Coming up soon in speedy maths:

w/b 9.7.18	To say 100 less than numbers to 3-digit. To say 100 more than numbers to 3-digit. Know 2x, 3x, 4x, 5x, 6x, 10x tables and division facts. Know pairs of numbers to 20.
w/b 16.7.18	To add hundreds to 3-digit numbers at speed. To say 100 more than and less than numbers to 3-digit. Know 2x, 3x, 4x, 5x, 6x, 10x tables and division facts. To x and ÷ any number by 10. Know pairs of tens to 100.

During the week we are going to be working on an art project to create a piece of art inspired by the Year 3 curriculum. The children will be making their own polystyrene printing blocks and then printing their own designs.

We hope those of you who could make it enjoyed the children's dance performance at the Summer Fun Day. It was lovely to see many of you there and we were both very proud of the children.

Next week, the children will be having their class parties. As a year group, we will be discussing what would make a good party for them. As a result, the children will come home this week with a note in their Learning Journal's with what they have volunteered to bring to the party and what day to bring it in.

Year 4 Weekly Information w/b 9.7.18

In English this week, we will be focussing on writing instructions. We are looking at the features of instructions and then applying these to our own writing.

This week the children will be tested on all of the words on the Y4 spelling list. Many thanks in advance for supporting your child with learning these spellings.

In maths, we are continuing to use our problem solving skills to solve a range of challenges. In science this week, we are looking at different habitats and how the animals who live there have adapted to them.

Coming up in speedy maths (* indicates new learning):

w/b 9.7.18	Use tables to work out related \times and \div at speed. Know all tables to 12x12 including division facts at speed. Know pairs of numbers to 100. Give change from £1 at speed
16.7.18	Know all tables to 12x12 including division facts at speed. Add three tens at speed. Use tables to work out related \times and \div at speed.

Next week our class party will be held in the afternoon on Wednesday 18 July. There is no need for children to bring a change of clothes. We would be grateful for a food contribution and will be putting stickers in the Learning Journals this week so that we do not get too much of one item! Year 5 Weekly Information w/b 9.7.18

In English this week, we will be exploring techniques for speaking and listening through drama. We will work in groups across the year group to create and perform.

In maths, we will be revising strategies for all number operations. We will be making sure we have a sound understanding of formal written methods, using numbers to two decimal places. We will be reflecting on our own learning and focusing on those areas we identify as challenging.

In speedy maths this week, we will be covering the following areas:

w.b: 2.7.18	Know pairs of numbers to 180. Add and subtract 2-digit and 3-digit numbers at speed. Add and subtract p from £&p
w/b: 9.7.18	Add and subtract pairs of 2-digit numbers at speed. Know all tables to 12x12 including division facts at speed. Convert m to km and vice versa Add and subtract 2-digit and 3-digit numbers at speed. Add 3 1-digit numbers at speed.

We will be building on last week's maths learning about tessellating patterns in computing this week. We will be creating tessellating shapes, featuring aspects from our cross-curricular learning to create pieces of artwork.

During the RSE session last week, children raised some questions that we ran out of time to answer so we will make time this week to answer the remaining questions.

On Friday, the entire school will be raising money for the Royal Marsden Cancer Charity. (This was a suggestion by the lovely children in 5B.) Everyone should wear a wig, hat or headscarf to school and make a donation at both the East and West gates in the morning or at the end of the day. Parents and carers are encouraged to join in the fun!
