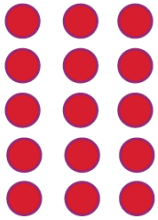


Year 1 Weekly Information w/b 11.6.18

In English this week we will be learning how to write information writing using main heading, sub heading and beginning to use paragraphs. We will be finding out about British wildlife and we will be creating facts files about different animals.

In maths this week we will be beginning to introduce multiplication. The children will learn how to represent multiplication as an array and to use the symbol of multiplication in written calculations. We will also be beginning to count in 2s, 5s and 10s.

e.g. This array shows 3 lots of 5. The corresponding calculations could be 3×5 or 5×3



We will be learning about our senses this week and how we use our senses. We will be completing a senses walk around the school.

Remember to keep practising all the Year 1 spelling words with particular emphasis on the ones your child wasn't sure about in the end of half term tests (in the back of their Learning Journal). They will be tested on all 100 words towards the end of term.

The children will be completing the Year 1 Phonics Screening Check this week. This will involve each child reading a mixture of words. We have completed similar activities plenty of times through the year, so it should not seem to be out of the ordinary for the children.

Year 2 Weekly Information w/b 11.6.18

Thank you so much to the parent helpers who came on our trip to Drusillas Park last week, especially those parents who stepped in at the last minute. We all had such a fun-packed day and we couldn't have done that without your help!

In English lessons this week, we will be learning about non-chronological reports. The children will learn that these are examples of non-fiction writing and can be found in many information books. They will learn about the features of a non-chronological report and will, as a class, contribute to writing a report about rainforest animals by the end of the week.

In maths we will be doing some work on data and graphs. We will be collecting data about different things (e.g. favourite colour, favourite food etc.) and turning it into pictograms and block graphs. Some children will be exploring what happens when 1 picture stands for 2 people's data on a pictogram. We will be asking and answering questions about the data we collect and using this information to write more than/less than/equal to statements:

e.g. **Favourite colour red** > **Favourite colour green**

Coming up soon in speedy maths (* indicates new learning):

w/b 11.6.18	*Add 10 to any number Know one more and one less including 3-digit numbers. Know division facts for 2x, 5x, 10x tables. Know number bonds to 20 Add 1-digit to 2-digits at speed.
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w/b 18.6.18	*Know pairs of number to 30 Subtraction facts to 20 Add 10 to any number including 3 digits.

Year 3 Weekly Information w/b 11.6.18

In English this week, the children will be working on their recount writing. We will be thinking about the use of chronological order, time connectives and paragraphs, whilst trying to use our descriptive writing skills to give detail about what has happened.

In maths this week, we are working with money. The children are going to be working on their confidence with £ and p notation. The children are then going to be thinking about working out total costs when buying more than one item and calculating change.

Coming up soon in speedy maths:

w/b 11.6.18	To say 100 more than and less than numbers to 3-digit. Know 2x, 3x, 4x, 5x, 6x, 10x tables and division facts. To x and ÷ any number by 10 Know pairs of tens to 100.
w/b 18.6.18	Subtract tens from 3-digit numbers at speed. Add tens to 3-digit numbers at speed. To multiply and divide any number by 10 at speed. Know 2x, 3x, 4x, 5x, 6x, 10x tables and division facts.

In our themed learning we are going to be finding out about the Spanish Armada and completing family trees for the Tudor monarchs. This week the children will also be learning about shadows and what causes shadows to occur.

We are also continuing to practise our dancing ahead of the Year 3 performance at the PTA Summer Fun Day. More details on the performance will follow soon.

Year 4 Weekly Information w/b 11.6.18

We are looking forward to our trip to High Ashurst this week. The children will be focusing on team-work throughout the trip as well as improving their skills of survival.

In maths we will be conducting an open ended investigation where we will apply the skills we have practised in Year 4.

Coming up in speedy maths (* indicates new learning):

w/b 11.6.18	Give change from £1 at speed Use tables facts to work out related x at speed.
w/b 18.6.18	Add and subtract pairs of 2-digit numbers at speed. Convert cm to mm and vice versa Add three tens at speed. Continue simple number patterns

In our themed learning we will be investigating the extent to which sugar is bad for teeth. We will be setting up an investigation and recording our observations and findings. In preparation for High Ashurst, we will be using flint fire starters to create a spark.

In Times Table Rock Stars news, we would like to congratulate Kane (4J) and Sam (4S) for significantly improving the time it takes them to correctly answer questions.

Year 5 Weekly Information w/b 11.6.18

In English this week, we will be exploring another classic text, 'Alice in Wonderland'. We will consider what genre the text is and whether we know any other similar stories. We will then be looking at which questions we can ask about the text and its accompanying illustrations. Children will also look at the characters and their motivations.

In maths we will be continuing to look at percentages. Children will practise working out fractions of a number. Children will then explore more investigative work involving percentages, such as calculating real-life shopping discounts.

In speedy maths this week, we will be covering the following areas:

w/b: 11.6.18	Know pairs of numbers to 90 Convert m to km and vice versa Add and subtract 2-digit and 3-digit numbers at speed. Add and subtract p from £&p Continue simple number patterns
w/b: 18.6.18	Add and subtract pairs of 2-digit numbers at speed. Convert L to ml and vice versa Add and subtract 2-digit and 3-digit numbers at speed. Add three tens at speed.

In computing, children will be creating their own game based on the Football World Cup. Children will be coding the game using Scratch.

This week, we will continue to sell ice lollies at both gates. Well done to children who have sold so far. They have been very successful!

On Friday we will be tested on our 12x table and spellings from 'persuade' to 'relevant' from the back of the Learning Journal.

Year 6 Weekly Information w/b 11.6.18

This week the children will be starting the theme 'Healthy Bodies, Healthy Minds'. We will be learning about the functions of the heart and the lungs. We will also be learning how to plan, carry out and report a scientific investigation.
