Year 1 Weekly Information w/b 16.10.17

The author for this week and the week after half term will be Julia Donaldson. During our English lessons we will be thinking about the rhymes that Julia Donaldson uses and coming up with our own rhymes. We will also be reading many of the Julia Donaldson books so if your child has any books at home that they'd like to bring in then please do- just make sure they are named.

This week we have our spelling test which will be in the back of the Learning Journal, so you will be able to see how your child got on. If there are still some words that haven't quite 'stuck' yet, remember to keep practising them. Our aim is that all children will know all the words by the end of the summer term.

All the classes will have the opportunity to bring things for Show and Tell this Thursday. Toys are not allowed, and please think carefully if your item is precious or expensive. Children may wish to bring in a photo or other item to represent an experience or something that is too large or precious to bring to school. Children can choose whether to take part, they do not have to bring something in.

In maths we will be assessing our understanding of everything we have learned about so far in Year 2 – we will revisit 1 digit numbers, 2 digit numbers, adding 10, subtracting 10, partitioning numbers into tens and ones and using more than, less than and equal to signs. We will also be refining our problem solving skills, trying to use the best and most systematic approach to find the solution.

This week in English, we are exploring similes and alliteration in more detail by looking at, and writing our own, poetry. Our maths lessons this week are going to focus on problem solving, working systematically to find all the possibilities. The children will also be completing a summary of learning task using all the different skills that we have been practising this half term.

Coming up soon in speedy maths:

w/b 16.10.17	Add two tens at speed. Know 4x table at speed. Know 3x table at speed. Add and subtract 2-digit to 1-digit at speed.
w/b 30.10.17	Add two tens at speed. Know 3x and 4x tables at speed. Know 10 more and 10 less than 3 digit numbers.

This week is also the school's Great Harvest Bake Off. The children all put stickers in their learning journals last week to indicate what they have volunteered to bring in and what extra ingredient their group has chosen to add. This week the children will be making their biscuits, complete with their group's choice of adaptation. They will also be creating decorations and planning how to organise the classroom.

Year 4 Weekly Information w/b 16.10.17

In English lessons this week, we will be learning to improve and edit our work and learning the spelling rule for the 'ze' sound as in measure. We will also be reviewing our reading test to see where we could improve. This week we will also be testing the children on the first 20 words from the Y4 spelling list. Your support with helping the children to learn these spellings would be greatly appreciated.

In maths, the children will be completing a summary of learning task. They will also be taking part in an open ended problem solving task where they will have to work collaboratively, whilst exploring different aspects of mathematics in order to reach a solution.

Coming up soon in speedy maths (* indicates new learning):

w/b 16.10.17	Know 7x table at speed. Know 9x table at speed. Add and subtract pairs of 2-digit numbers at speed. Know halves and doubles of numbers to 20. Know number bonds to 20.
w/b 30.10.17	*Know 8x table at speed Add and subtract hundreds and 3-digit numbers. Know 2x, 3x, 4x, 5x, 6x, 10x tables and related division facts at speed. Divide any number by 10. Know pairs of numbers to 100.

As part of our themed learning, Greece is the Word, the children will be learning about the Ancient Olympic Games and comparing them with the modern day Olympics. We will then be holding our own mini Olympic Games.

On Wednesday Y4 will be cooking for the Great Harvest Bake Off. **Please note this is a change of day from the information we gave you last week.** Please could children bring in the ingredients and equipment for making pizzas on this day (see Learning Journals for more information).
