New School Lunches

Following the implementation of the new school meal ordering system, please find below the answers to some of the FAQs:

How do I add credit to my meal account?

Once you've logged into your account, Dinners Money (Aspens) will appear at the top, under 'Account balances'. To order school dinners, you must be in credit. Therefore, enter the top-up amount and click 'Add to basket'. You can then click 'View basket' and checkout in order to add money on to your school dinner account. Once this is done, you will be able to select your school meals by clicking the 'Order meals' button next to Dinner Money.

How can I choose what meal my child will have?

Children are able to choose their meal at the point of service. When you order a meal on Tucasi, just select 'M' and your child will be able to choose their lunch when they collect it. The 'how to' guide from Tucasi does include information about selecting a specific meal but we have decided not to use this function as it does not allow for the range of choice available.

How do I order meals using the mobile website?

When you go to the Tucasi website on a mobile device, you will be asked if you want to go to the mobile site. This is fine for making payments but you will not be able to order meals through the mobile site. You can still use your mobile device – just select 'cancel' when asked if you want to use the mobile site.

Is there a plan to make the meal ordering more user friendly?

We have fed back to Tucasi that the process for ordering meals is quite time consuming, especially when ordering for multiple days. They have acknowledged the issue and will consider adding this in to their development programme but they cannot make any promises regarding the outcome or timescales.

How do I access the Aspens Services Menu app?



Through the app you can see what's on offer for lunch with just a couple of presses on your smartphone. Just search for the app at the App Store, install, add the unique PIN 78430287

We hope you enjoyed the Easter break. Welcome back to what promises to be a busy and exciting term for Year 1.

In English we will be writing a recount of our Easter holidays focusing on writing full sentences using the correct punctuation. We will also be practising punctuating sentences and writing information writing about Spring.

In maths this week we will be focusing on subtraction. We will be finding the difference by counting up from the smaller to the larger number. The children will then be learning how to write the corresponding subtraction calculation and answer.

As part of our new theme of learning 'Building Blocks' the children will be walking to Epsom Primary School to observe the buildings and to sketch the outside of the school.

Year 2 Weekly Information w/b 16.4.18

Welcome back to the Summer term! We can't believe how quickly the time has flown and that we are into the last term of Year 2!

As we are beginning to prepare the children for their transition into Key Stage 2 in September, we want to continue to encourage good habits with homework and having a completed Learning Journal every week. Some children might even be ready to begin completing their Learning

Journal themselves (with your guidance of course). As we want to foster good habits, in preparation for Y3, if a child hands in a **blank Learning Journal** with their homework book, they will be asked to attend Extra Homework Time on a Wednesday lunchtime in order to complete it. We hope that you'll support us in making sure it's completed and help the children understand the value of setting good habits.


In English, we will be continuing with our focus on 'Charlie and the Chocolate Factory'. We will be developing our descriptive writing, focusing on the characters we have met so far in the story. We will also be using our understanding of the text to write different types of texts e.g. letters and newspaper articles.

In maths, we will be linking our work on multiplication to learning about its inverse operation of division. The children will be understanding that multiplication can be done in any order – commutative (like addition), however division must begin with the largest number (like subtraction). We will be getting the children to demonstrate their understanding of multiplication by representing it in different ways – such as:


Multiplication sentences – e.g. $5 \times 2 = 10$

Repeated addition sentences – e.g. $2 + 2 + 2 + 2 + 2 = 10$

Skip counting - e.g. 2, 4, 6, 8, 10

Arrays - e.g. 

Towards the end of the week, we will begin to look at how we can split up an array to help us understand division.

E.g. $10 \div 2 = 5$

In maths, we will be re-visiting written calculations. The children will be using written methods for addition and subtraction to solve problems. They will be working on identifying what operation is required to solve the problem and then using the appropriate method accordingly.
