Year 1 Weekly Information w/b 2.7.18

In English over the next couple of weeks we will be reading Horrid Henry by Francesca Simon. We will be writing character descriptions using adjectives and correct punctuation and we will be planning and writing our own versions of the story with an emphasis on producing a longer piece of writing. If your child would like to bring in any Horrid Henry books from home they are welcome to, but please make sure they are named.

In maths this week we will be completing a range of investigations based on real life problems. The children will need to use a range of mathematical skills and equipment to help them to answer the questions.

A reminder about our exciting trip to The British Wildlife Centre this week (1W and 1R Tuesday 3 July and 1A and 1F Wednesday 4 July). Children must wear school uniform. A sunhat will be needed and sun cream applied before coming to school. Please bring water bottles. Book bags will not be needed on trip days.

The children will need a packed lunch. If your child usually has a school meal on a Tuesday or Wednesday it will be provided by the school kitchen (unless you have already informed us differently). If you wish to send additional snacks to supplement the lunch then you are most welcome but please respect that we are a nut-free school. Year 2 Weekly Information w/b 2.7.18

In English lessons this week, we will be continuing our writing based upon the Peter Rabbit stories by Beatrix Potter. This week we will look at the story of Jemima Puddleduck – the children will be writing questions to task 'Jemima' and answering them as if they were her!

In maths we will be re-visiting our previous work on 2D and 3D shapes and their properties as this is something the children found tricky to explain clearly and concisely. We will be using riddles to explore the properties of these shapes, starting off by reading riddles and solving them and later in the week writing our own riddles about a chosen shape.

Year 3 Weekly Information w/b 2.7.18

In English this week, the children are going to be finishing some poetry work, including exploring cinquains in greater depth. They will be thinking about the words they use to describe actions and feelings whilst also having to pay attention to the poem's strict syllable structure.

In maths this week, we are going to do start a project on collecting and representing data in order to answer a question. The project will also make use of other skills we have practised recently such as reading scales accurately when measuring.

On Friday, we are going to be showing the Year 3 Relationships and Sex Education video to the children. Year 4 Weekly Information w/b 2.7.18

The children are looking forward to our Year 4 assembly and sharing our High Ashurst experiences with you on Friday at 9.00am.

We would like to remind you that this is the last week of homework tasks. Please could you remind your child that both compulsory tasks need to be completed.

In English this week, we will be focussing on inference skills through poetry. We will also be having a grammar focus with an emphasis on proof reading and editing skills.

Coming up in speedy maths (* indicates new learning):

w/b 2.7.18	Use tables to work out related \times and \div at speed. Know all tables to 12x12 including division facts at speed. Know pairs of numbers to 100. Give change from £1 at speed
9.7.18	Know all tables to 12x12 including division facts at speed. Add and subtract pairs of 2 digit numbers at speed. Use tables facts to work out related \times at speed.

In our themed learning we will be recognising that living things can be grouped in a variety of ways. We will learn how to use a classification key and develop this skill to create our own to categorise animals. We will also be creating our own food chains and looking at the relationship between producers and consumers. Also in science we will be looking at how the environment can be impacted upon by humans. We will be researching negative issues such as global warming and littering and positive impacts such as nature reserves and community initiatives.

Next week the children will be tested on all of the words on the Y4 spelling list. Many thanks in advance for supporting your child with learning these spellings.

Year 5 Weekly Information w/b 2.7.18

In English this week, we will be looking at the use of speech punctuation. We will look at the way that speech is handled in our reading books. We will also look at reported speech and consider what advantages there are to using this technique. We will then move on to writing effective dialogue of our own.

In maths, we will be revising strategies for all number operations. In particular, we will be looking at division and method for dividing by two digit numbers. We will also be looking at tessellation – how shapes repeat and interlink. We will be using our knowledge of tessellation to produce a piece of art.

In speedy maths this week, we will be covering the following areas:

w.b: 2.7.18	Give change from £1 at speed Know all tables to 12x12 including division facts at speed. Convert cm to m and vice versa Add and subtract 3-digit and 1-digit numbers Add three 1-digit numbers at speed.
w/b: 9.7.18	Know pairs of numbers to 180. Add and subtract 2-digit and 3-digit numbers at speed. Add and subtract p from £&p

On Wednesday morning, we will be going to Blenheim High School to participate in their annual STEMfest. This is a celebration of maths, science, engineering and technology. As this counts as a local visit, there is no need to give permission for this trip and children will be back in time for lunch as usual.

On Friday we will be assessing our 6 and 7x tables table and we will randomly select spellings from the Y5 words at the back of the Learning Journal.

This week, we will also be covering the Year 5 modules from SRE.
