Year 1 Weekly Information w/b 21.5.18

In English this week we are continuing with the 'Lighthouse Keeper' stories and the children will be focusing on adding description to their writing and writing their own versions of the story. Whilst in maths we will reviewing the learning from this half term.

This week will also be this half term's spelling test. These 20 words are the hardest of the 100 High Frequency words, so your child may find it tricky this time. Next half term the spelling homework will be to review all 100 words, meaning that there is plenty more time to practise the ones that your child hasn't quite got yet!

In speedy maths the focus will be on adding 2 to a number (e.g. $35 + 2 =$); these can also be described as "two more than" and will also include the addition facts for pairs of numbers that total 20 (e.g. $14 + 6 =$).

On Wednesday all four classes will be having Show and Tell time. As ever, please ensure that any items coming into school are clearly name labelled. We have discouraged the children from bringing anything too precious or expensive, and toys are not allowed as part of Show and Tell.

Thank you for all of the returned Golden Books. Remember that they need to be returned as they are kept at school until the children are in Year 6.

We are hoping that the weather continues to be good for Sports Day on Thursday. Don't forget that your child will need a packed lunch (school dinner children will be provided with a packed lunch), a hat and a water bottle. As always during sunny weather, please apply sun screen to your child before school. The cloakrooms will be cleared on Wednesday, with PE kits being sent home. Children should wear their PE kit to school on Thursday and will not need their book bag.

Year 1 will be visiting the British Wildlife Centre as part of their next half term's theme of learning 'Sensational World'. If you are available to accompany us on this trip please email Mrs Williams williamse@stamford-green.surrey.sch.uk. The trip will be a full day aiming to return by 3.00pm, depending on traffic.

We will be having a maths focus in class this week, working with money. The children will be making money amounts in different ways, trying to be as systematic as possible. We will be adding and subtracting money amounts revising the methods we have learned previously (partitioning, drawing dienes, number lines).

Coming up soon in speedy maths (* indicates new learning):

w/b 21.5.18	*Count in $\frac{1}{4}$ s to 10 Know number facts to 20 (ml) Know one more and one less including 3-digit numbers. Double numbers to 20. Know 2x, 5x, 10x tables and division facts.
w/b 4.6.18	*Add 10 to any number Know one more and one less including 3-digit numbers. Know division facts for 2x, 5x, 10x tables. Know number bonds to 20 Add 1-digit to 2-digits at speed.

Year 3 Weekly Information w/b 21.5.18

In English, the children are going to be returning to the poetry writing we did earlier in the year so that we can create haikus for a competition about the 'lost words' of Epsom. The children will be writing and editing haikus about the following 'lost words': riphook, plashing, kissing-gate, hedgepig, haycock, fuzzchat, beeskep, flittermouse.

In maths this week, the children will be thinking about 3D shapes. At the beginning of the week we are going to be practising naming 3D shapes and giving information about their properties e.g. faces, edges and vertices. We are also going to be making our own 3D shapes and exploring how many different ways you can make a net for a cube.

Coming up soon in speedy maths:

w/b 22.5.17	To say 100 more than numbers to 3-digit. Subtract tens from 3-digit numbers at speed. Know pairs of numbers to 100. Know 2x, 3x, 4x, 5x, 6x, 10x tables and division facts.
w/b 5.6.17	To say 100 less than numbers to 3-digit. To say 100 more than numbers to 3-digit. Know 2x, 3x, 4x, 5x, 6x, 10x tables and division facts. Know pairs of numbers to 20.

In our themed lessons this week, we will continue learning about aspects of Tudor life. As part of this, the children will find out more about Tudor clothing and will be comparing those of rich Tudors and poor Tudors as well as comparing clothing from the Tudor period with those from a different period in history. The children are also going to be starting a project to create books about Francis Drake.

On Thursday it is Sports Day – we look forward to seeing those of you who can make it. Don't forget that the children need to arrive at school in their PE kit with a hat, water bottle and having applied sun screen.

This week in maths we will be going over our summary of learning and revising some of the topics where mistakes were commonly made.

Coming up in speedy maths (* indicates new learning):

w/b 21.5.18	*Know division facts for 12x table at speed. Add and subtract pairs of 2-digit numbers at speed. Know pairs of tens to 180 Add three tens at speed.
w/b 4.6.18	Give change from £1 at speed Use tables facts to work out related x at speed.

In music this week we are learning how to describe music with vocabulary such as duration, timbre, pitch, beat and tempo. In computing we will be using Excel to extract information from databases by sorting data. We will continue to work on our art work for the annual Bourne Hall exhibition art competition.

In Times Tables Rock Star news, we congratulate Emilia (4J) who has become a Rock Hero and manages to answer questions in under a second! Well done also to Evie (4S) who is a Rock Legend and has halved her time taken to answer questions correctly. Keep it up Year 4!

Year 5 Weekly Information w/b 21.5.18

In English this week, we will be focussing on reading skills. These include information retrieval and inference, where we need to 'read between the lines' to understand the meaning. Later in the week, we will be applying these skills to a summary of learning.

In maths, we will be concentrating on our reasoning skills, where we need to carefully read and understand problems to solve them appropriately. We use the acronym RUCSAC to help us with these problems – **R**ead, **U**nderstand, **C**hoose, **S**olve, **A**nswer, **C**heck. We will then be applying these reasoning skills to a summary of learning.

In speedy maths this week, we will be covering the following areas:

w/b: 21.5.18	Add and subtract pairs of 2-digit numbers at speed. Know pairs of numbers to 100. Convert m to km and vice versa
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Good luck to all the Year 5 children taking part in the drama production, 'High School Musical', this week. We all watched it this afternoon and it was fantastic! All your hard work has really paid off.
