Year 1 Weekly Information w/b 25.6.18

In English this week we will be focusing on information writing. We will be linking English to Science and finding out about tree and plants that are common in Britain. We will also be learning about the different parts of plants and what they are called.

In maths this week we will be learning about capacity. We will be introducing mathematical terms of millilitres and litres. The children will be learning how to put containers into order of capacity. On Friday 29 June we will be having an exciting time learning about capacity with lots of water activities. We will be asking children to bring in some clothes that can get wet (i.e. t-shirt and shorts), a small towel and flip flops/crocs/old shoes or similar as they will be dealing with lots of water. Looks like the weather will be ideal for this on Friday. Even though Friday is Mufti day the children will still need a change of clothes.

In speedy maths the children will be carrying on a number sequence when counting in 1's and rehearsing adding two 1 digit numbers together at speed.

**Year 2 Weekly Information w/b 25.6.18**

In English lessons this week, we will be beginning some work based upon the Peter Rabbit stories by Beatrix Potter. Over the coming weeks, the children will be experimenting with different styles of writing linked with some of these stories including character descriptions, using the 4 different sentence types, non-chronological reports, letters and lots more! This week we will be exploring the tales of Peter Rabbit and Benjamin Rabbit.

In maths we will be re-capping previous learning on time to see if we understand it better this time. Using just the hour hand last week has really helped some children have a better understanding of telling time to the quarter hour. As this is quite an abstract concept, it would really help if you supported our work at school by asking your child what time it is now at home. You can challenge them by asking what time it was 1 hour ago or in 1 hour from now. Practise makes perfect!

In a couple of weeks we will be finishing off our Wild Planet theme of learning by making habitat boxes! For this, each child will need a cardboard box – a shoe box with lid is perfect! If you don't have a shoe box, then a shoe box-sized cereal or parcel box will also work. Please save a box for your child and we'll let you know when to send it in to school for this exciting project!

**Year 3 Weekly Information w/b 25.6.18**

In English this week, we are going to be creating information pages about the school. The children will also be looking at different forms of poetry and considering how to use words effectively. We will particularly be looking at cinquains, a five-lined poem with a given syllable structure.

In maths, the children will be revisiting ideas from earlier in the year, including look at angles and perimeter. Later in the week, we will be analysing data and using it to draw bar graphs.

Coming up soon in speedy maths:

w/b 18.6.18	Subtract tens from 3-digit numbers at speed. Add tens to 3-digit numbers at speed. To multiply and divide any number by 10 at speed. Know 2x, 3x, 4x, 5x, 6x, 10x tables and division facts.
w/b 25.6.18	To say 100 more than numbers to 3-digit. Subtract tens from 3-digit numbers at speed. Know pairs of numbers to 100. Know 2x, 3x, 4x, 5x, 6x, 10x tables and division facts.

In our themed lessons, the children will be learning about exploration after the Tudor period. We are going to be researching modern day explorers and following up last week's work on the voyage of Charles Darwin by linking it to our science work on animals.

We will be continuing our preparations for dancing at the PTA Summer Fun Day by practising our traditional dancing. The PTA Summer Fun Day will be held on **Saturday 7.7.18** and the children will be performing a selection of traditional dances. We will update you soon with specific timings of when the children are due to perform. At this stage, we need to know if your child cannot attend the Summer Fun Day so that we can arrange positions for the dances. If you know that your child will not be able to attend this event, please email Mrs Smith (see below). Nearer the time, we will give further details regarding where and when we will meet on the day. Year 4 Weekly Information w/b 25.6.18

In English the children will be using an iPad app called book creator to create a non-fiction book all about digestion. The children will be using their computing research skills to gather necessary information.

In maths we will be applying the skills we have learnt so far in Year 4. We will be working in teams to solve a range of problems.

Coming up in speedy maths (* indicates new learning):

w/b 25.6.18	Know all tables to 12x12 including division facts at speed. Know pairs of tens to 180 Add and subtract pairs of 2-digit numbers at speed. Know pairs of numbers to 90
w/b 2.7.18	Use tables to work out related x and ÷ at speed. Know all tables to 12x12 including division facts at speed. Know pairs of numbers to 100. Give change from £1 at speed.

In music we will be learning about the different notes used in music, focusing on crotchets, quavers, rests, minims and semibreves.

In addition this week we will be writing our Year 4 assembly about High Ashurst. We hope to see as many of you as possible on Friday 6 July at 9.00am when we perform it to families.

Year 5 Weekly Information w/b 25.6.18

In English this week, we will be using descriptive language to write about the volcanic eruption in AD79. We will be choosing which genre to present our work – diary entry, recount, poem, narrative, etc.

In maths, we will be investigating mathematical vocabulary. We will be working in pairs to use it to build clues for a problem. Once the problems have been created, we will be attempting to solve each other's creations, identifying key vocabulary that leads to the answers.

In speedy maths this week, we will be covering the following areas:

w/b: 25.6.18	Add and subtract pairs of 2-digit numbers at speed. Convert L to ml and vice versa Add and subtract 2-digit and 3-digit numbers at speed. Add three tens at speed.
w/b: 2.7.18	Give change from £1 at speed Know all tables to 12x12 including division facts at speed. Convert cm to m and vice versa Add and subtract 3-digit and 1-digit numbers Add three 1-digit numbers at speed.

In geography, we will be using maps and atlases to locate countries on a world map. We will be using the countries whose football teams are playing at the FIFA World Cup.

On Friday we will be tested on our 5 and 6x tables tables and spellings from 'system' to 'variety' from the back of the Learning Journal.

Next Monday at 2.30pm, we will be holding an information meeting for parents for our upcoming RSE (Relationships and Sex Education) learning. Parents will be able to view the video we show the children and ask any arising questions.
