### **Year 1 Weekly Information w/b 8.5.18**

There is great excitement in Year 1 this week as we are making our models of schools! Initially we will be generating ideas and planning our buildings then we will follow our plans to make the schools we designed. We will also be evaluating our models to see how they compare with the original plan and explaining any changes.

Thank you for the modelling contributions – we would still like more cardboard boxes, clean plastic bottles, tubes, trays and other containers to give us plenty of options. The building will take place on Thursday and Friday so anything more before then would be much appreciated.

In speedy maths the focus this week will be adding and subtracting 1-digit and 2-digit numbers at speed. The children are now working towards completing many more calculations in the time than they've done previously.

On Wednesday and Thursday this week the children will be walking to Epsom Primary School to observe the architecture and sketch the outside of the building. The children will also be developing their map work skills and following the route there and back on the map.

A big thank you to all of the adults that have volunteered to come with us to Epsom Primary School. Your time is very much appreciated.

Don't forget children need a named water bottle in school every day and sun cream applied before school. Children should also have a named sunhat.

We hope that you have enjoyed having a look at your child's Golden Book. Don't forget to fill in the sticker at the end of the Summer Term work and return to school as soon as possible.

### **Year 2 Weekly Information w/b 8.5.18**

Golden Books will be coming home this week. Please complete the parent sticker with a positive comment about your child's work then return to school when you've looked at it.

In English this week, we will be finishing our unit of work on Charlie and the Chocolate Factory. The children will draw comparisons between the book and the most recent film of Charlie and the Chocolate Factory. This film is a PG, please let us know if you do not wish for your child to watch it. We will also be continuing to practise our grammar skills, particularly focusing on suffixes and adverbs and applying them in their writing.

In maths, we will be learning about time. The children will revise o'clock, half past, quarter to and quarter past times from Year 1 and begin to talk about the 5 minute intervals going around the

clock – e.g. 5 past, 10 past etc. We will be making our own analogue clocks which the children will use in their maths work this week. They will practise making times using the minute hand and the hour hand and draw the hands on an analogue clock making sure there is a clear difference between the minute hand and the hour hand.

### Year 3 Weekly Information w/b 8.5.18

In English this week, the children will be starting another of our whole class texts, 'The Diary of a Killer Cat' by Anne Fine. The children will be developing their ability to make the reader feel a certain way (e.g. happy, scared, sad etc.) through their creative writing. They will also make decisions about characters when they write from the perspective of another animal.

In maths we will be reminding ourselves about lots of this year's learning so far. We are going to practise calculation strategies and work on shape during the week. On Friday we will be independently answering questions based on everything we have been working on in Year 3.

Coming up soon in speedy maths:

w/b 7.5.18	Add tens to 3-digit numbers at speed. To divide any number by 10 at speed. Know pairs of numbers to 100. Know 2x, 3x, 4x, 5x, 6x, 10x tables and division facts.
w/b 14.5.18	Subtract tens from 3-digit numbers at speed. Add tens to 3-digit numbers at speed. To multiply and divide any number by 10 at speed. Know 2x, 3x, 4x, 5x, 6x, 10x tables and division facts.

In our themed learning this week, we will be continuing our Explorers theme. The children will be learning about the Tudor monarchs that came next after Henry VIII. They will learn about the circumstances around Edward becoming King as a child followed by Mary I.

The children have begun learning dance routines as part of their PE curriculum on 'traditional dance' and will be performing at the PTA Summer Fun Day on Saturday 7 July (time TBC). Please put this date in your diaries as we would love to see as many of you there as possible.

### **Year 4 Weekly Information w/b 8.5.18**

We hope you enjoyed looking at your child's Golden Books. Please can you write a positive comment on the sticker and return the book when you have looked at it.

In English this week we will be looking at pictures as a stimulus for writing. We will be using illustrations from 'The Mysteries of Harris Burdick' to build character descriptions. The children will also be describing settings to evoke a mood or atmosphere.

In maths lessons we will be revising symmetry, including reflective and rotational symmetry. We will also be exploring co-ordinates and translating 2D shapes in the first quadrant.

Coming up in speedy maths (\* indicates new learning):

w/b 7.5.18	Add and subtract pairs of 2-digit numbers at speed. Use tables facts to work out related x at speed. Convert cm to mm and vice versa
w/b 12.5.18	* Add three tens at speed. Know pairs of numbers to 90 Add 3 1-digit numbers at speed Continue simple number patterns

In theme this week we will be looking at WWII from the German perspective. In science we will be looking at how we hear and also investigating how sound changes over distance. In computing we will use Excel to budget. We will input data and formulae.

The children are continuing to work hard on Times Tables Rock Stars. Well done to Callum (4S), Shay (4S), Emily (4J) and Harpreet (4J) who have really improved their average speed of correct answers.

### Year 5 Weekly Information w/b 8.5.18

In English, we will be focusing on reading skills. Children will explore a range of texts and will be considering information needed to answer a question. They will learn to skim and scan texts and to ensure that answers are sufficiently detailed without taking too long to write.

In maths, we will be looking at word problems. Children will practise solving two-step word problems. These are the types of problems where it is impossible to solve one thing until something else has been worked out first. Children will also learn to deal with questions where unnecessary information has been included.

In speedy maths this week, we will be covering the following areas:

<b>08.05.18</b>	Know pairs of numbers to 100. Know all tables to 12x12 including division facts at speed. Add and subtract 2-digit and 3-digit numbers at speed. Continue simple number patterns Know number bonds to 1000 (tens)
<b>14.05.18</b>	Add and subtract pairs of 2-digit numbers at speed. Know pairs of numbers to 180. Convert L to ml and vice versa Add and subtract 2-digit and 3-digit numbers at speed. Add and subtract p from £&p

On Friday, children will be tested on their 9x tables and from 'equipment to frequently' on their spellings.

### Year 6 Weekly Information w/b 8.5.18

In English, we are revising how to predict using clues within the text. We are also revising grammar, spelling and punctuation rules. We will be encouraging the children to look at areas they are still unsure of e.g. particular spelling rules and to spend some time at home practising and revising these.

In maths we are revising ratio, fractions, decimals, percentages and how to 'get into' multi-step word problems. We will also be practising all the written methods for arithmetic. Again, we will be encouraging the children to identify any areas of maths they are unsure of and to practise at home this week. For your convenience, please see the method for long division below:

### Long division written method:

Children divide up to 4-digit by 2-digit using Long Division:

$\begin{array}{r} 576 \\ 15 \overline{)8640} \\ \underline{-75} \phantom{0} \\ 114 \phantom{0} \\ \underline{-105} \phantom{0} \\ 90 \end{array}$	<p>15 into 8 doesn't go so look at the next digit. 15 goes into 86 five times so put a 5 above the 6. <b><math>15 \times 5 = 75</math></b> Take away 75 from 86 to get the remainder 11. Carry the 4 down to make 114. 15 goes into 114 seven times so put a 7 above the 4. <b><math>15 \times 7 = 105</math></b> Take away 105 from 114 to get the remainder 9. Carry the 0 down to make 90. 15 goes into 90 exactly 6 times so put a 6 above the 0.</p>
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In light of Y6 taking their National Curriculum Tests next week, we will not be taking in homework on Tuesday 15 May. Instead, the children will be required to revise and practise any areas they need to develop and feel confident in.

### National Curriculum Tests

As you will be aware, the children will be taking their KS2 National Curriculum tests next week. The tests will take place in the mornings and we would ask all children to be prompt to school every day. To help the children settle in the mornings, Year 6 will be able to come into school from 8.30am – they should enter via the East Gate or buzz at the West Gate. We will provide them with a drink and snack at the start of the day. This is not a replacement for breakfast, just a little something to give them an energy boost and to settle any nerves.
