### Year 1 Weekly Information w/b 9.10.17

We will continue to think about the stories of Jane Hissey this week. We will be making up our own stories with some of her characters such as Old Bear, Bramwell Brown, Jolly Tall and Little Bear. As well as telling stories to each other, we will write some stories as a class and on our own. We will also begin to think about how to plan a story.

In maths we will be looking at number facts. This includes number bonds to 10 (Ways of making 10).

This week in speedy maths we will be counting quickly and accurately using pictures and rehearsing number formation. We will also be writing missing numbers. The children will be checking that they have written the numbers round the right way.

The Golden Books will come home this week and we would appreciate it if you could fill in the sticker on the 'summary' page. The children have worked really hard and they will love to hear your positive comments! Please return to school when you have enjoyed looking at your child's learning and filled in the sticker.

Next week will be 'The Great Harvest Bake Off'. Year 1 children will be making 'Mud Pies' (edible ones!) – requests for equipment and ingredients will be sent home on a label in each child's Learning Journal by Thursday of this week – we intend to make them on Wednesday of next week (18.10.17).

You will notice that there is no place in your child's Learning Journal for them to record their house points. Children record their house points in the classroom using counters. The Year 1 teachers give the 'House Points Certificate' in the Learning Journal for a particularly good piece of work or effort. We will write a comment in the space on the back of each certificate explaining why it has been given.

### Year 2 Weekly Information w/b 9.10.17

Sometime this week your child will bring home their Golden Book. Please look through the learning that has taken place and then complete the parent sticker (stuck after the last piece of work). Once you have finished looking at the Golden Book, please return it to your child's class teacher for safekeeping. Thank you!

In English we will be looking at the text 'Alien's Love Underpants' to gain a deeper understanding of description. We will be using the illustrations as prompts to help us write descriptive sentences. We will also be strengthening our skills gained from writing recounts, to write recounts about the aliens.

In maths we will be continuing our work on place value. We will be consolidating our understanding of tens and ones in a range of 2 digit numbers and representing these in a range of practical situations – such as with 10p's and 1p's and bead strings. We will be revisiting using the more than (>), less than (<) and equal to (=) signs in order to compare a set of numbers.

### Year 3 Weekly Information w/b 9.10.17

In English this week, the children will be thinking about how to make their descriptive writing interesting. Using interesting description is one of our main focuses in Year 3 and the children will be developing a toolkit to use throughout the year. This week we will be describing the area

around us and then using a video to write descriptively about a volcano.

In maths this week, we will be working on collecting and representing data. The children are going to be drawing bar charts and will make them more complex by varying the interval on the y axis. They will also be analysing the information in bar graphs so that they can answer questions.

500g plain flour

1 large mixing bowl  
Biscuit/Cookie cutters  
Air tight container (suitable for 30 large biscuits)

#### **Year 4 Weekly Information w/b 9.10.17**

In English this week, the children will be writing Greek myths, using their story mountains and including their own mythical characters. We will also be looking at using prepositions and adverbs effectively. Next week we will be testing the children on the first 20 words from the Y4 spelling list. Please can you support your child in learning these words.

In maths this week, the children will be working on shape, focusing especially on different types of angles and lines of symmetry.

In our themed learning this week, the children will be using their knowledge of Ancient Greek theatre to make masks.

Next week the children will be taking part in the Great Harvest Bake Off! In Year 4 we will be making pizzas and the children will be varying the toppings. Year 4 will be making their pizzas on Tuesday 17<sup>th</sup> October so please can they bring in the required ingredients and equipment on that day (not before please). All equipment should be named.

Please see below for the basic recipe. The exact recipe, with the group's chosen adaptation, along with equipment list, will be included in your child's journal by Thursday 12 October. Further information regarding the bake sale will be included in next week's weekly information email.

Ingredients:

250g plain flour  
1 teaspoon dried active baking yeast  
1 pinch salt  
300ml water  
1 tablespoon olive oil

**Toppings (to be decided by each group)** such as  
Tomato sauce

mozzarella cheese, sliced or grated  
ham, mushrooms, peppers, olives, as desired

Equipment

Mixing bowl  
Sieve  
Whisk  
Wooden spoon x 2  
Rolling pin  
Metal spoon  
Cheese grater  
Air-tight container x2 (big enough for 4 pizza slices each)

Method

- Whisk together the flour, yeast and salt. Stir in the water and olive oil, adding more flour a little at a time if the dough is too sticky. Form the dough into a ball, cover and let the dough rest for 15 minutes.
- Preheat the oven to 200 C / Gas 6. Spread the dough onto a generously floured baking tray.
- Spread the sauce over the pizza base, layer on the mozzarella cheese and add other ingredients as desired.
- Bake in the preheated oven until the pizza base is puffed and golden, about 15 minutes.

## Year 5 Weekly Information w/b 9.10.17

In English, we will be looking at spelling words with silent letters and trying to identify patterns, e.g. a silent 'k' is followed by an 'n'. We will also be applying our reading skills to retrieve information and infer meaning from texts.

In maths, we will be continuing our work with the Chinese bar method and apply this to word problems. We will be concentrating on what is asked in the question by reading it carefully and identifying the necessary operation, before applying this to answer the question properly.

Our themed learning this week will concentrate on the Berlin Wall and how it made news when it was erected in 1961. We will look at the wall's influence on life in Berlin, attempts to cross the wall and ultimately how it came down in 1989, becoming the catalyst for the reunification of Germany.

Next Thursday is the Great Harvest Bake Off. We look forward to welcoming you into school that day. In Year 5, we will be making flapjacks in small groups. The children will be given a basic recipe and their group will decide how they wish to adapt it. Each group will decide who will be bringing which ingredients and equipment and this will be written in their Learning Journals. In the meantime, for your information this is the basic recipe:

225g butter  
225g demerara sugar  
75g golden syrup  
275g porridge oats.

Epsom Golf Club came into school today to teach the children some golf skills. The children very much enjoyed this and we are looking forward to seeing them for the second session next Monday.

The focus for this week's spelling test will be the next five words in the Year 5 spelling list at the back of the Learning Journal (equipment - forty). We will also focus on the 6x table for the tables test.

## Year 6 Weekly Information w/b 9.10.17

This week in English we will be looking at the different ways a comma can be used and will then apply this to our writing. We will also be focusing on the spelling rule for words ending in 'able'/'ible'.

In maths, we will be looking at how to calculate ratios of ingredients to scale a recipe up or down. We will then be putting this into practice for the Great Harvest Bake Off. We will also be revising long division and identifying and explaining patterns in number.

It is soon going to be the Great Harvest Bake Off (19 October) and Year 6 will be making fairy cakes. They will be using the recipe below and adapting it within their group by adding some ingredients of their choice and calculating ratios of ingredients to scale up or down the amount of cakes made. Part of our focus will be on the children accurately measuring their ingredients – some practice of this at home would be beneficial.

### Basic Ingredients:

100g softened butter  
100g caster sugar  
2 large eggs  
100g self-raising flour  
1 level teaspoon baking powder  
Makes 12

### Equipment

2 x 12 cake baking tins  
Fairy cake cases  
Wooden spoon  
Metal spoon (for folding in flour)  
Bowl in which to mix ingredients  
Fork  
Small bowl (for beating the eggs in)  
Tin/box (to store cakes)  
Apron  
Kitchen scales  
Sieve

We will be cooking on Tuesday 17 October and your child will soon be bringing home a list of the exact items that they need to bring in. Your help with this would be very much appreciated.
