What a fantastic week we had last week! The new Reception children made a super start to life at Stamford Green and it has been excellent to see them enjoying exploring their new school. We have been very proud to see lots of examples of resilience, friendship and kindness from the newest members of our school.

This week children will begin to bring home a story book each day for you to enjoy together. This is a way for children to begin the routine of changing their book each week, thinking about stories and having a 'reading time' at home each day. Learning Journals will be handed out and we ask that you write a short positive comment in the relevant day to record the reading that your child has done at home. You could write any comments that they made about the story, for example.

The classes have been so confident and independent when coming into school, with the children now saying goodbye to you at the gate and making their way to their classrooms independently as the rest of the school does (rather than lining up). The Reception staff are on hand along the route to make sure that everyone is heading in the right direction. You can help them by saying goodbye and waving them through the gate then leaving (rather than waiting and waving until they are out of sight). This means they are able to concentrate on making their own way to the classroom for their day, rather than looking back towards the gate. Please do not stand on the blue spots (East Gate) or in the gate path as this blocks the route for other children.

If you are a parent/carer who is not yet part of the class WhatsApp group and would like to be, please have a look on the <u>website</u> to get the details of your class rep. This group is a great place for reminders about things happening at school and a good way to feel part of the school community.

This week's learning in Reception at a glance:

Learning Question of the week:

Which would be the best material to build a house for the Three Little Pigs?

At school this week we will be continuing to explore the Reception learning space - trying out more of the activities that are on offer, and talking about how to learn and play together successfully.

The first stop on this term's tour of some well-known Fantasy Lands will be tale of the Three Little Pigs. The children will be listening to, and retelling, this familiar story as well as having the opportunity to participate in a range of creative activities. The learning stems from a special question of the week (see above) but it isn't limited to answering this – children explore the story in their own way using their creativity and imagination to respond. Perhaps you have a version to share at home?

In our 'Fantasy Lands' learning we will focus on traditional tales from now until after October half term so look out to see which ones the children will be learning about in the upcoming weekly information.

Phonics Reading

The children all had a short phonics assessment during the staggered entry period, and we will now start learning the routines for our phonics lessons - Read Write Inc. You can find out about the Read Write Inc programme by watching this short film. https://tinyurl.com/2k4t46fy

This week we will be learning about the sounds m, a, s, d:







Around the apple and down the leaf



Slither down the snake



Around the dinosaurs bottom and up to his neck

In your child's Book Bag this week you will find their reading pack and Learning Journal. The story books in the pack are to be shared each day with your child at home. These will be changed in school so please ensure that this pack along with the Learning Journal is in the Book Bag every day. Please record the stories you share together in your child's Learning Journal.

Maths

In maths this week we will be focusing on the number 1. As well as recognising and writing the digit 1, we will look at other ways to represent it, and how to find one more.

We also have a daily class 'Maths Meeting'. The Maths Meeting activities help us to develop key mathematical skills such as reasoning and comparing. Below is an example of what we look at together. In the green boxes are some of the types of questions we may talk about.

Today is Tuesday. We think about: Which one do you think is the odd one out? You might say 'the cat is the odd one out because it is a land animal and the rest live in the We might think about: sea". How many stars can you see? How do you know? How many would we have with one more? One less? We think about: Can you identify the pattern of the bears? Can you continue the pattern in both directions? The pattern is green, blue, green, blue... There are two parts before the pattern repeats itself so we call this a two-part repeating pattern.

Sickness

If you do keep your child at home, you must report the absence using the link on our Website by 8.00am on the day of absence.

School Lunches

From 1 October 2023 the cost of a school lunch will increase to £2.70. This is the first increase in the cost of a school lunch for many years and we have worked with Accent to keep the rise to a minimum and ensure that the cost is in line with that charged by other local schools.
