Sickness

School Lunches



Library Days

1B - Thursday 1H - Friday 1S – Tuesday

The children will have brought home library books this week. Please see above the days they will be visiting the library.

It is a good idea to keep their library book in their reading folder so that they always have it with them at school.



In maths this week, we will begin by recognising numbers as words. We will then look at counting on from any given number and remembering we don't always need to start from 0 which leads on to exploring 1 more than a number.

Our wider curriculum this week includes science. We will be exploring more about the seasons

and will be going on an autumn walk to observe how the trees and plants are changing.

In computing, we will be practising logging on using our log ins and having a go at navigating Purple Mash.

In the outside area we are exploring traditional tales and characters. We will also be looking at pictures of what Epsom looked like in the past, linking to our history learning.

In art we will be looking at ways of drawing lines and how our grip on the pencil can change the marks we make. We will be having a go at trying to draw lines in different ways, straight, dotted, wavy, horizontal, vertical to name a few as well as looking at the pressure we use to create dark and light lines.

In RE, we will be thinking about the creation story as we continue to learn about Christianity. We will be exploring how the story explains what God created and how this is considered a gift to Christian people.

Postponed Victorian Day

This day has been postponed to later in the year to fit in with our learning.

In English this week, we will be responding to texts and sequencing in chronological order. We will be using adverbs of time in writing and when sequencing stories and writing in the past tense. We will also be learning how to make our writing even more interesting by adding adjectives when describing what is happening. We will be sequencing and writing about the story 'Toby and the Great Fire of London' by Margaret Nash and Jane Cope.

In reading, we will be continuing to read the story 'Meerkat Mail' by Emily Gravett. We will be retelling the story in order and answering questions to explain our understanding of the text. This will include writing answers to questions to check out comprehension.

In Spelling Shed this week the children will be learning to spell words where the 'ge' makes a 'j' sound e.g. change, charge, range, hinge, strange etc.


The Spelling Shed assignment will be set on Tuesday and 5 Spelling Bee assignments are to be completed by the following Tuesday. When you click on the assignment it brings up Spelling Bee and a range of games. Spelling Bee needs to be completed five times a week and games completed are extras and will not count against the weekly spelling assignment.

The spelling quiz will take place on Friday and will be completed in the children's Learning Journals.



1. Search for Wonde on google.




2. Login as a student




3. Search for Stamford Green Primary School

In maths, we will be learning how to partition numbers to 100. This will include grouping numbers into 10s and ones in a variety of ways using different representations. Children understand that if, for example, 32 is made up of "3 whole tens" and "2 ones", then the 3 represents 30 and the 2 represents 2. Therefore, 32 can be partitioned into 3 tens and 2 ones or 30 and 2.

In science, we will be inspired by learning about a famous scientist, Charles Macintosh. We will know that he was a scientist known for inventing a waterproof fabric, making it possible for people to stay dry, even in wet weather.

In design technology, we will be starting to investigate which mechanism is best to use for a moving vehicle. The children will be recapping their knowledge from Year 1 of the different types of mechanisms and making samples of each.

Year 3 Weekly Information w/b 18.9.23

My Maths

In Year 3, our online homework task alternates each week between a My Maths and a Spelling Shed activity. The children have been shown how to access My Maths through Wonde. My Maths then requires a further log on – these details are on a sticker in your child's Learning Journal.

Spelling

Please can you take some time to revisit and revise the Year 1 and 2 high frequency words with your child, eg saw, she, her, because, beautiful, etc. In Year 3, the spellings rules we learn become increasingly complex and the children need to have these words embedded to build on a strong foundation. Thank you for your support.

Homework

A My Maths homework task will be set this week and is due in on Tuesday next week (26.9.23).

In English this week, we will continue to use the story 'Katie and the Dinosaurs' as a stimulus for our descriptive writing. We will also be looking at the conclusion of the story and trying to devise our own alternative ending. A key skill we will be developing throughout the year is that of editing and improving our writing. We will look at this week's writing to establish good practice going forward. In our reading, we will be focusing on explaining events in a text. To help with this at home, ask you child to explain what has just happened in the book you read together.

These are the spelling words for our quiz this week. We would appreciate it if you could please help your child to practise them at home.

In maths this week, we will be continuing to work on place value. We will be exploring numbers up to 1,000 and examining how we can partition these in different ways. We will also be looking at the difference between base ten and place value counters to help us further understand these numbers.

In science this week, we will be asking the question 'Are all rocks the same?' We will be using chocolate to learn about the difference between igneous, sedimentary and metamorphic rocks and how they are formed! In RE, we will be considering what art can tell us about the life of Jesus. In history we begin our enquiry 'How did life change from the Palaeolithic to the Iron Age?' We will be learning about what prehistoric means and developing our timeline skills. In art, we are starting our new enquiry 'How do artists use proportion?' In the first lesson, we will be looking at how different methods to draw in proportion and using the line method in our own drawing. In computing, we will continue to develop coding skills.

Our homework activity is a My Maths activity which looks at hundreds, tens and ones. This will be available from Tuesday 19 September and is due to be completed by Tuesday 26 September.

In English this week, we will be continuing our work on myths. At the beginning of the week, we will be thinking about how to use descriptive devices effectively to describe Greek Gods. We will think about the effect of using show not tell in our writing through a shared write and independent writing by the end of the week.

In maths this week, we will be continuing our learning about place value, this time focussing on numbers to 10,000. We will be applying our previous knowledge about representing these numbers in different ways as well as partitioning them in different ways. The children will initially partition numbers to 10,000 using their place value properties: E.g. 4,245 = 4,000+200+40+5 and will move onto consider how we can use 'flexible partitioning' with these numbers too: E.g. 4,245 = 3,000+1200+40+5

Year 5 Weekly Information w/b 18.9.23

Swimming

In English we will be learning about the features of newspaper reports, using the toolkits we made last week. We will continue to read copies of *The Week Junior* to develop an understanding of this text type. The children are enjoying our Reading book, *The Boy at the Back of the Class* by Onjali Q. Raúf – can your child summarise the story so far to you? This week in class and on Spelling Shed we will be thinking about spelling words ending -cious.

The children will be having a spelling quiz on Friday on these words:

In maths this week we will be building on our place value knowledge by looking at powers of 10, partitioning numbers up to 1,000,000. We will be using concrete resources such as number lines, place value charts and Gattegno Charts to aid with our learning.

In history this term we will be asking Why was there such a short time between the first flight and man landing on the moon? In DT, we will be experimenting with different ways to make joints, ensuring that they are secure and fit for purpose.

In science, we will be continuing to learn about forces, focusing on air resistance and whether an objects surface area has an impact on its speed of falling. We will be testing this using our own parachutes of different sizes.

In PSHE we will be thinking about what our rights and responsibilities are in our school and asking ourselves: Are there things we take for granted that other children may struggle with?

In maths, we are continuing our work on place value by positioning large numbers on a number line; comparing and ordering numbers; and rounding integers to a given degree of accuracy.

In the wider curriculum, we are beginning a geography enquiry into where our energy comes from by investigating which natural resources are used to create power and what the pros and cons are of each resource. In PE and games, we will be working throughout the half term on our gymnastics and football skills.

As mentioned last week, you may have seen the letter that was sent out that Drama Club is one of the clubs that are run for Y6 children. We are really excited to announce that our Drama Club production for this academic year will be 'Annie Jnr'. We will be holding auditions after school on Thursday 21 September until 4.10pm.
