1S have shown fantastic effort in their learning recently. They will have a muffi day on Thursday 19.10.23 for filling their pasta jar. Well done 1S!	Thank you to everyone who has volunteered to help us with our trips to Epsom Library. We now have enough volunteers. If you offered to help please look out for a sticker in your child's Learning Journal this week.	Can you write these words in a sentence?

In maths this week, we will be finding number bonds to 10. Number bonds are pairs of numbers that can be added together to make another number e.g. 4 + 6 = 10. We want the children to be confident and fluent with their number bonds to 10, so this is something we will revisit often. We will be looking at how we can work systematically to ensure we find all of the possibilities.

Our wider curriculum this week includes science. We will be having a class debate about which season is our favourite and will answer our enquiry question of 'What if there was only one season?'

In PSHE, we will be revisiting our MindUp curriculum and will be thinking about what it means to be mindful and unmindful.

In the outside area we will be creating season pictures. Using maps and construction equipment the children will be making mini versions of Epsom town centre. The children will continue their maths learning about part whole models using hoops and bean bags.

In art we will be continuing our learning about Sonia Boyce and having a go at drawing selfportraits looking at facial proportions.

In RE we will be continuing to look at how Christians show gratitude using examples from the Bible.

The children have shown great resilience during this first half term and have really accepted many challenges with courage and determination.

Geography

In preparation for our fieldwork in the park after half term (on the day of our Mosque trip) you might like to have a look at a map with your child. Can they find our school and Court Recreation Ground? Which route could we take to walk from there back to school? In English this week, we will be learning how to edit correctly. We will be working on a range of skills such as correcting punctuation and tense in our written work and we will be correcting sentences by rewriting them to demonstrate our understanding.

In reading, we will be completing a summary of the story 'Pumpkin soup' by Helen Cooper. This will include answering the questions who? where? what? when? and why? In order to help us to summarise the story.

In Spelling Shed this week the children will be learning to spell words where 'wr' makes a 'r' sound at the beginning of words e.g. write, wriggle, wrap, wrestle, written etc.

The spelling quiz will take place on Friday and will be completed in the children's Learning Journals.

In maths, the children will be adding and subtracting ones from a given number. They will start to spot patterns when adding and subtracting 1s and link these to their knowledge of number bonds.

If children know, for example, that 3 + 1 = 4, then they can use this to understand that 23 + 1 = 24 and 53 + 1 = 54.

The children will then use their knowledge of number bonds to 10 to add numbers within 20. We will be adding three 1-digit numbers, recognising that to add three numbers, they just need to add two of them and then add the third to the answer. They will use their number bonds knowledge to decide which numbers to add first. They will also use this knowledge to add to the next ten for example, to find the missing number in 28 + 2 = 30, they can use the fact that 8 + 2 = 10.

In science, we will be testing the three 'fabric sandwiches' we made last week and will be able to say if they are waterproof and how we know. We will be recording and discussing our results.

In DT, we will be designing our balloon powered vehicles using axles and labelling the different parts. After half term we will be building these and testing them to see how far they can travel.




In English this week, we will be using Oliver Jeffers' 'The Way Home' as a writing stimulus. We will watch the short video of the story and formulate questions to understand the character's feelings at different parts of the story. We will use this to write a character description later in the week, including the descriptive features we have been focusing on this half term – adjectives, alliteration, simile and onomatopoeia.

In maths this week, we will be using our number bonds knowledge to add and subtract ones and tens that cross over a boundary, eg 275 + 70, 362 - 9. Below is a method we will be using in class to help with our mental arithmetic. Why not try some questions at home?

In science this week, we will be consolidating our learning about the properties of rocks. We will be doing a rock survey around the school looking at how rocks (including man-made rocks such as concrete and bricks) are used. In history, we will be thinking about how settlements evolved during the Neolithic Period. We will be considering evidence that a nomadic way of life was coming to an end as people began to grow food and keep livestock. In art, our lesson will focus on using scale. We will be practising how to scale a drawing up using the grid method.



In English this week, we will be finishing our class book 'Varjak Paw'. We will be thinking about what features we would find in a book review and then creating our own, based on our opinion of Varjak Paw. Towards the end of the week, we will be recreating the front cover of the book, thinking about how to make it as eye catching and powerful as possible.

In maths this week, we will be building on our prior knowledge of adding two 4-digit numbers with one exchange, by seeing how more than one exchange would work. Our focus will be on showing our working out clearly and methodically using counters on a place value chart alongside the column addition, ensuring the exchanges are recorded accurately. Later in the week, we will be moving onto subtracting two 4-digit numbers, initially with no exchange, then one exchange and finishing with more than one exchange taking place. See below for how this is taught at school and how you could preview this learning with your child at home to give them a head start:

In English, we will be working in teams to create our own newspapers and using the news report writing skills we have learned this half term. We will be finishing our reading book, The Boy at the Back of the Class and thinking about how we can explain the plot's key themes. As well as finally learning our narrator's name, we will make links with our PSHE learning about British Values, society and the Rights of the Child when explaining our understanding of Ahmet's experience as a refugee. This week in class (and optionally on Spelling Shed) we will look at Year 5 spelling challenge words.

The children will be having a spelling quiz on Friday on these words:

In maths, we will be using prior learning to solve multi step addition and subtraction problems. We will then compare calculations to explore their structure in order to make a comparison. This will help us understand how to use a given fact to derive other answers.
