Parents/others who have parental responsibility are: In England and Wales, if the parents of a child are married to each other at the time of birth, or they have jointly adopted a child, then they both have parental responsibility. Parents do not lose parental responsibility if they divorce; this applies to both the resident and non-resident parent. This is not automatically the case for unmarried parents. According to current law, a mother always has parental responsibility for her child. A father, however, has this responsibility only if he is married to the mother when the child is born or has acquired legal responsibility for his child through one of these three routes: 1. (from 1 December 2013) by jointly registering the birth of the child with the mother, 2. By a parental responsibility agreement with the mother or 3. By a parental responsibility order made by a court. Living with the mother, even for a long time, does not give a father parental responsibility and if the parents are not married, parental responsibility does not always pass to the natural father if the mother dies.

#### 1. Nursery Admissions for two year olds

Four (full time equivalent) 2 year old places will be available in our Nursery and these will be reserved, initially, for families who are eligible for FEET funding. If further spaces are available other 2 year old children will be considered. Children aged 2 years old from working families (who meet the criteria) will be eligible for 570 hours of early education and childcare per year. Funding commences in the term after they turn 2 years old. We will be offering this entitlement as 15 hours per week for 38 weeks per year, in line with the academic year.

## 2. Nursery Admissions for three and four year olds

## Early Education and Childcare Entitlement

Currently, 3 and 4 year olds are entitled to 570 hours of early education and childcare per year, known as the **universal entitlement**. At our Nursery, this is offered as 15 hours per week for up to 38 weeks of the academic year. Children aged 3 and 4 years old from working families (who meet the criteria) will be eligible for the **extended entitlement** of 1140 hours per year. We will be offering this extended entitlement as 30 hours per week for 38 weeks per year, in line with the academic year. This extended entitlement is optional so parents are able to choose between the universal or extended entitlement for their child/ren (subject to availability of spaces).

Primarily the criteria are:

- Both parents are working and earning between £6,000 (approx) and £100,000 each per year.
- In the case of a single parent family, the sole parent is working and earning between  $\pounds$ 6,000 (approx) and  $\pounds$ 100,000 per year.
