YR Christmas party in school is this Friday 9 December (No change of clothes required) Don't forget to bring in your party contribution.


(Look out for a sticker in your child's Learning Journal on last week's page, with a suggested contribution)

It was lovely to see so many of the YR families enjoying the festivities at the PTA Christmas Fair on Sunday. A huge thank you for buying your child's Christmas decoration. They worked really hard on these! If you would still like to purchase your child's craft, they are welcome to bring in £2 donation and they will bring it home in their bag.

On Friday 8 December we will be enjoying our class Christmas parties! We'll play party games and share in a little party tea during the afternoon at school. There is a sticker in your child's Learning Journal to ask for them to bring a small amount of food to share (to ensure that we don't end up with everyone bringing the same!) Each child will be asked to bring six of the same items, e.g. six individual packets of crisps, six cakes. You won't need to supply enough for the whole class. When buying please keep in mind that we are a nut-free school.

A thoughtful parent/carer has let us know that their Reception child has had headlice and has been treated. Please check your child's hair in case they need to be treated too. Please remember that all hair longer than shoulder length should be fully tied back at school, this not only helps children to concentrate without their hair getting in the way of their activities, but also limits the spread of lice when children are in close contact with each other.

When writing this week, we continue to focus on using the correct tripod pencil grip (your children know nip, flip and grip very well now!)

Maths

In maths we will focus on all the numbers from 1-10 and practise recognising these in context as well as having our daily maths meetings where we think about numbers, reasoning, patterns and comparing amounts.















We have been looking at different shapes each week, including 2D (flat) shapes and 3D (fat) shapes. Can your child spot any shapes in your home? Perhaps you could go on a shape hunt together?

Show and Tell

This week (Thursday 7 December) the Pentagons group from each class will have their turn at Show and Tell and the theme is family. Show and tell is an opportunity for each child to share something special with their class practising their speaking skills. The rest of the class practise their listening skills and have the chance to ask questions too. Your child might want to share a picture or drawing of their family to talk about. The other groups will have their turns to show and tell as the term goes on.
