Y3 Book Recommendations:	Thank you	Homework
Fizzlebert Stump and the Bearded Boy by AF Harrold AF Harrold came in to talk to the children as part of our SGPS 50 th birthday celebrations. This book is a story about friendship, fiendish schemes, emergency tuna and the importance of proper beard care!	A big thank you for all your support this term. The year is flying past - we're a third of the way through the year already! Best wishes for a relaxing and enjoyable break and a happy and prosperous 2024.	There will be no homework set this week due to the Christmas break!

In English this week, we will have a grammar focus. We will be learning when to use 'a' or 'an' depending on whether the following word begins with a vowel (or vowel sound). We will also look at word choices and how the meaning of a sentence is affected by our word choices. Having finished 'The Sheep Pig', we will be watching the film adaptation of the book, 'Babe'. We will be comparing this to the original story and identifying similarities and differences.

These are the spelling words for **after the holidays**. We would appreciate it if you could please help your child to practise them at home.

For review:	great, would, behind
Might be new:	though, actual, describe
Can you do?	favourite, particular

In maths this week, the children will be trying to solve some Christmas challenges where a systematic approach will be useful. After the Christmas break, we will move on to our 8 x table.

Coming up soon in speedy maths (*indicates new learning):

In science this week, we will review our learning over this half term and use our knowledge to answer the enquiry question, 'Why don't all rocks and soils look the same?'. In history, we will be bringing our enquiry question, 'How did Life Change from the Palaeolithic Age to Iron Age?' to a close with a focus on the Iron Age.

There will not be any homework set this week due to the Christmas holidays.

We are incredibly proud of how hard the children worked and the beautiful performance they gave.

We are certainly in the Christmas mood now and hope you are too! **Times tables**

By the end of Year 4, it is expected that children will know all times tables up to 12×12 .

You can help support your child with this by:

- making sure they are doing daily TTRS sessions for at least 5 minutes
- looking at what's coming up in speedy maths to familiarise the children in advance
- practising particularly stubborn facts to learn at any opportunity e.g. in the car, in the bath, as you are leaving the house etc.

In English this week, we will be completing a range of fun Christmas based activities. We will be thinking about using cursive handwriting throughout a piece of writing, making sure our letters are all the same height. We will also be using our knowledge of descriptive devices to describe a range of Christmas scenes. We will be thinking about how we can use our senses to add to the detail of our writing.

This week's spelling quiz words (taken from the Y4 Autumn term list) will be:

For review:	eight, guide, important
Might be new:	question, naughty, interest
Can you do:	system, neighbour

In maths this week, we will be completing a range of Christmas themed problem solving activities. We will be using our times table knowledge to help Mrs Claus crack Christmas codes, create our own multiplication Christmas cards and work systematically to work out different bauble colour combinations.

In the wider curriculum, we will be bringing our science enquiry into classification to an end by creating our own classification keys for animals and discussing the question 'Why can't a fish live on land?'. We're also looking forward to our Carol Service on Wednesday.
