


Year 1 Weekly Information w/b 15.1.24

In maths this week, we will be focusing on our numbers to twenty looking at how we can develop our understanding of 17, 18 and 19 as 1 ten and some ones, or "10-and-a-bit".

In PSHE, we will be continuing with our Dreams and Goals puzzle piece. This week we are thinking about what skills we need, to work co-operatively with others. We will aim to complete an activity with a partner that requires co-operation, patience and teamwork.

In science, we will continue our investigation into different types of trees. This week we will be looking more closely at the features of evergreen trees and how these change during the winter months.

In computing, we will be practising our sequencing skills through creating simple instructions to help complete a sequence of events.

In RE, we will be continuing our learning about Judaism focussing on the celebration of Shabbat and what Jewish families do to prepare for their Friday night traditions.

In DT, we will be thinking about designing our hand puppets to make sure they appeal to children either their age or younger.

In geography, we will be answering our learning question - where is Peru? We will be exploring Google earth and maps to locate Peru.

Science

If you have any spare seeds or bulbs at home (or can collect any from plants in your garden), please send them into school, as we are learning about them in science and will be observing them closely in order to draw them.

In English this week, we will be beginning to learn about conjunctions and how we can accurately use them in our sentences. We will be learning how to join two clauses together using and, so, but, because, that, when, if. We will be learning to write a range of sentences using conjunctions about different topics and about the book 'The Day the Crayons Quit' by Oliver Jeffers.

In reading, we will be starting a new book called 'The Proudest Blue' by Ibtihaj Muhammad. We will be focusing on a range of reading skills when discussing this text. We will be working on our retrieval, vocabulary and inference skills and learning to use the text in order to demonstrate our understanding.

In Spelling Shed this week the children will be learning to spell words where 'er' and 'est' are added to words ending in 'y' e.g. happier, happiest, angrier, angriest, drier, driest. The spelling quiz will take place on Friday and will be completed in the children's Learning Journals.

In maths, we will be finishing our topic on money and will be looking at how to add coins together to make a pound and how to find change from a larger amount of money. We will be moving on to our new topic of multiplication and division. We will be looking at how to find and make equal groups from larger numbers.

In science, we will be learning about what seeds and bulbs are and will be observing some closely, using magnifying glasses to produce scientific drawings. We will also be learning about the inspiring scientist Maria Sybilla Merian and her work studying and drawing insects and plants.

In art, we will be learning about Antony Gormley and looking at his sculptures, the Angel of the North and his Field series. We will be thinking about how this art makes us feel.

In PSHE we will be looking at growing older and looking at physical changes in our appearance as we get older. If your child has any photos of them and members of their family who are older than them, please could you send them in for this lesson to help them to look at physical changes that happen with age.

The children in Year 2 are allowed to play with their friends across the year group. Sometimes we may encourage children to play with a wider circle of friends or to have a friendship "holiday" in order for them to make new friends. This will always be discussed with the child/children as we support them so they have a happy playtime.

The children will be learning, in depth, the features of a diary and how to apply this when writing independently. We will be looking at rules when writing in the past tense, using the first person and how fronted adverbials can help us add detail to our writing.


In English this week, we continue to look in detail at the features of our report writing. In reading, we will be looking at how Shakespeare's Romeo and Juliet would have been performed to an audience in a theatre. This week in class and on Spelling Shed (this week's homework) we will look at words that are adverbs of time.

The children will be having a spelling quiz on Friday on these words:

In maths, we will be working on division, beginning with reminding ourselves of the previous methods used. The formal calculation is now shown alongside familiar models, in particular part-whole models, place value counters and place value charts. This way, the structure of short division will become clear, enabling the children to see the relationship between the model and the formal written method.

Autumn 2 and there being no daylight in Spring 1, children will need to be collected after a club in these terms.

Crazy Hair

It's the PTA's Crazy Hair Day on Friday. What will we see in Year 6?

Each class is also looking forward to some reward time in the afternoon. 6DA have voted for a specific reward and will write it in their Learning Journals.

In English this week, we will be using our year group text 'The Explorer' to refine our inference skills. In our writing sessions, we are going to be practising skills that would be useful when writing an adventure story. We will be looking at how subordinate clauses can be used to add more information, how vocabulary choices can affect the atmosphere of a piece and how we can create tension in our writing. On Friday we'll be bringing these elements together to write about the picture below:

In maths, our focus is on units of measurement. We'll be converting metric units of measurement (for example, metres to centimetres to millimetres); performing calculations with units of measurement and taking a closer look at imperial measurements like feet, inches, ounces and pounds. We'll be describing, discussing and predicting patterns related to times tables in our problem solving lesson.

In the wider curriculum, we will continue to develop our knowledge of Banksy and how he achieves success with his artwork. We will experiment with stencilling to achieve desired results. In Science, we are looking at inheritance: the features that offspring inherit from their parents and characteristics that are learned, not inherited. In history, we are looking at when the Maya civilisation existed and creating timelines.

Please note, this half term, our PSHE lessons from the Jigsaw scheme are on the topic 'Changing Me', which includes the relationships and sex education (RSE) elements of the Year 6 curriculum. Our lessons with a specific RSE focus will be in the weeks commencing 15.1.24 and 22.2.24. An outline of the areas being covered is as follows:
