Headteacher's Headlines

Dear Families,

I wanted to start the newsletter by wishing a happy Diwali to all our families who celebrated last weekend.



The theme for Anti-Bullying Week 2023 this year is 'Make A Noise About Bullying' and has been taking place this week. The week kicked off with Odd Socks Day on Monday 13 November, where adults and children wore odd socks to celebrate what makes us all unique.

Too often, we are silent when we see bullying take place, silent about the hurt bullying causes, and silent when we hear bullying dismissed as 'just banter'.

We have been looking at the difference between banter, which is the playful and friendly exchange of teasing remarks, and bullying which is the repetitive, intentional hurting of one person or group by another person or group, where the relationship involves an imbalance of power.

Banter can make friends feel closer to each other in a light hearted and fun way. Banter can show that friends trust each other. We need to recognise when banter becomes something someone doesn't like and then also when it becomes bullying.

Of course, we won't like everyone, and we don't always agree, but we can choose respect and unity.

Volunteers

We are so grateful to all members of our school community who are able to offer their time to help the children have such a positive learning experience. We believe that volunteers provide a valuable contribution to the school's work in ensuring that each child reaches their potential. This includes our Reading Heroes who come into school to hear the children read, our Library Guardians who help look after the library and trip volunteers who offer to help on school trips enabling them to go ahead successfully and safely.

In order to have clarity about the role of a volunteer and to keep all children safeguarded, we have written a Volunteer Code of Conduct which we now ask our regular volunteers to read and sign that they will adhere to and it is shared with our occasional volunteers (e.g. parents and carers who assist on a trip) as part of the briefing meeting before a trip leaves the school. This includes highlighting who our school safeguarding leads are, what to do if there is a concern about behaviour, professional behaviour that is expected of the volunteer, for example. I am Simon Williams and am a coopted Governor at Stamford Green. I have been a Governor at Stamford Green for over 11 years, which includes four years as Chair of Governors. All my children attended Stamford Green and have all benefited greatly from their time at the school.

During my time at the school, both as a parent and a Governor, I have

seen lots of changes at Stamford Green and have seen the school go from strength to strength and into the fantastic school that it is today. I am passionate about learning culture, and feel that a strong culture helps every child in the school fulfil their own potential.

As part of the schools raising achievement plan, I am the monitoring Governor for Project Kaleidoscope. This is a whole school shared strategy to prepare and practice, so we can showcase our everyday excellence and exceptionality. I have recently met with Mrs Druce to monitor progress on this project. As part of this review, we discussed the communications with the school community about the new Ofsted Framework as well as the development of Subject Leaders across the School.

LEARNING

In addition to teaching their class, each teacher assumes a responsibility for either a curriculum subject or an area for responsibility across the school. This will range from leading a curriculum area such as history, geography or science or leading on an initiative such as homework, Times Tables Rockstars, organising Christmas nativities or working with the Community Prefects to name a few! All of these contributions help to ensure that we are able to offer the children a varied and vibrant learning experience.

In order to develop our curriculum subject leaders further, this term we have been working closely with educational consultant Jamie Hallums. Jamie is an experienced school leader who has a wealth of experience with the primary curriculum, contributing to excellent professional development for each subject leader. As part of the subject review, each subject leader has had a day working 1:1 with Jamie, looking at their curriculum up close and in detail. Each review has comprised of discussions about the subject and what it looks like in our school, seeing lessons in action, looking at books and talking to children about the subject. Following each review, Miss Swann meets with the subject leader to plan for actions following the review – this may include updating staff with recent research or planning further professional development and training.

Already this term we have reviewed PSHE, PE, Spanish, science, maths and geography. This week Jamie is in school working with Mrs Price on our Design Technology curriculum and Mr Vidal on our history curriculum. A new robot called Digit, designed to be human-like and that is capable of lifting and moving items, is being tested in warehouses of the online retailer. Amazon. The robot is in its first few weeks of trials at Amazon's facility in Seattle, USA, as the company tries to improve automation in its processes. To begin with, the robot is being taught to pick up and move empty boxes to ensure that they are ready for reuse. The yellow boxes, or totes, are used throughout the company's fulfilment process.
