Every Parent/Carer of a registered pupil at the school is eligible to vote. The voting procedure is as follows:

- You will receive an email on Tuesday 6 February with a link to vote. Please do not forward this email, as its survey link is unique to you. If there is someone you believe is eligible to vote but has not received a link please contact Ms Saunt. clerk@stamford-green.surrey.sch.uk
- As there are two vacancies, each Parent/Carer eligible may vote for up to two candidates, regardless of how many children he/she may have registered at the school.
- Voting must be completed by Tuesday 27 February at 12 noon.

The election will be decided by a simple majority of votes cast. In the event of a tie, the successful candidate will be decided by the returning officer drawing lots in the presence of a witness and any candidates who have attended the count.

Candidate 1 – Lisa Chan
