This week in reading the children will be choosing a book from the class reading corner. The children will then give a review of the book for the class explaining what the book was about and why they liked it.



Year 6 Weekly Information w/b 25.3.24

6L won a mufti day for their efforts in the Golden Run a few weeks ago. We'll be having this on Wednesday, 27.3.24.	For Year 6, the school day finishes at 12.50pm (East Gate) and 12.55pm (West Gate) on Thursday. We hope you have a relaxing break.	If your child knows they need any more cardboard boxes for their electrical circuit game, we will be working on these again on Tuesday, 26.3.24.

In English this week, we will be working on our editing and revising skills by revisiting our nonchronological reports from last week in order to improve them. We will be challenging ourselves to find and edit errors in work that is not our own, too. As we will be finishing our year group text, *The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe* this week, on Thursday, we will be watching the film so that we can compare it to the book, discuss which we preferred and why aspects might be different. Here's some further books to look out for if your child has enjoyed reading about Narnia:



In maths, our learning focuses on percentages. The children did some introductory work on this in Year 5 and we'll start by calculating simple percentages by way of a recap, before learning how to convert fractions into percentages. In problem solving, we'll play our last number game of the term, 'Factors and Multiples', where they'll work against their partner to use all the numbers in a hundred square.

Coming up soon in speedy maths:

w/b 25.3.24	Add and subtract pairs of 2-digit numbers at speed. Know common equivalent fractions, decimals and percentages. Use tables to work out related x and ÷ at speed. Add and subtract 2-digit and 3-digit numbers at speed. Continue simple number patterns
w/b 15.4.24	Know pairs of numbers to 100. Know common equivalent fractions, decimals and percentages. Convert m to km and vice versa Use tables to work out related x and ÷ at speed.

In the wider curriculum, our geography lessons have us investigating the similarities and differences between the human and physical geography of the Amazon Rainforest and Epsom. We will be looking at things like urbanisation, public transport, infrastructure and greenery – aiming to understand why there is a stark difference between the two areas. Our DT lessons involve us continuing to develop the first iteration of our electrical game, evaluating whether it is fit for purpose and starting to think of the vision of our branding to cater and appeal to a target audience.
