







In maths this week, we will be continuing our learning as an introduction to multiplication and division by looking at arrays. This will involve children recognising and adding equal groups to arrange objects in columns and rows as arrays. This arrangement helps children to see the equal amounts and how they are grouped. Encourage your child to draw arrays at home as they begin to explore the fact that they can describe arrays in two ways, for example 3 rows of 2 and 2 columns of 3.

In English this week, we will be completing our non-chronological reports. We will be editing our







writing by checking it makes sense and that punctuation and spelling are correct.

In reading, we will be finishing the book 'The Invisible' by Tom Percival. We will be reading in pairs and focusing on fluency and expression. We will then read in pairs to the class where we will 'perform' what we have been reading as a class. We will be focusing on how reading with expression can convey emotion.

The spelling quiz assignment will be set on Tuesday. This week's assignment will be to spell words where 'o' makes an /u/ sound e.g. other, mother, brother, nothing, cover, money, some, dozen, wonder, done. This week's spelling quiz words are below. The spelling quiz will be completed on Tuesday 29 April in the Learning Journal.

In maths this week, we will be finishing our unit on measurement, solving word problems using the four operations of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. We will then do an assessment.

In science this week, we will be answering our enquiry question 'Does a big plant need a big seed?', knowing that some big plants grow from tiny seeds and some small plants grow from big seeds. A seed has everything it needs to start growing into a plant, but the size of the seed doesn't always decide how big the plant will be.

In PSHE this week, we will be learning about which foods give us energy. We will talk about healthy foods that give us energy, and unhealthy foods that give us energy, but for a shorter amount of time, for example chocolate and sweets. We will consolidate our learning from this half term, and talk about how we can be healthy and happy.

In geography this week we will be answering the question 'How are coastal regions geographically different to Epsom?' we will be focusing on the similarities and differences and discussing the human and physical features of both coastal regions and Epsom.

Homework

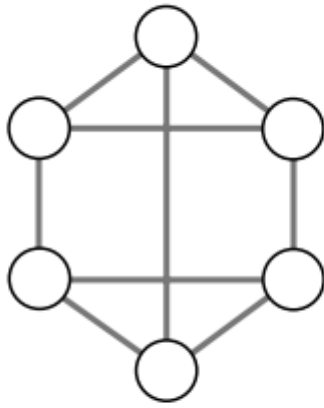
There will be no spelling quiz words or homework task this week as next week is the Easter holidays.

Please continue to read, work on common spellings e.g. 'saw' and play Times Tables Rock Stars.

In English this week, we will continue writing our fairy tale stories. We'll be thinking carefully about how to edit and improve our writing. We'll also be working on character descriptions and prepositions e.g. under, between, among, beneath.

In maths this week, we are going to be looking at scales and measuring in grams and kilograms. We will be reading marked and unmarked divisions on scales and working out when measurements given in grams or kilograms are equivalent to each other. Our last problem solving lesson of the half term will need us to draw the problem and use skills like keeping track of what we have already tried. Is there more than one possible solution?

Use each of the numbers 1 to 6 once.

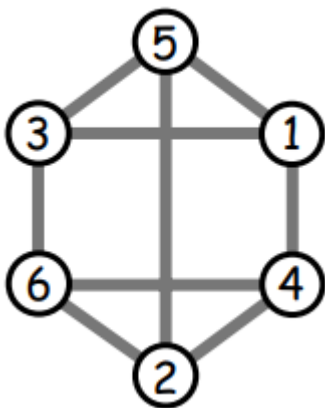

Items from home

Just a reminder that the children should not be bringing in stationery or toys from home.

In English, the children will edit and improve their poetry, both as a class and independently. They will then have the opportunity to read and perform their poetry aloud. In reading, they will continue making predictions about the latest chapters of the Last Bear.

In maths this week, the children will take part in a maths quiz to consolidate their understanding of fractions. Later on in the week, we will use our understanding of fractions, to begin our work on decimals.

There will be an interclass TTRS battle from Monday 31 March to Thursday 3 April. As a reward for the highest scoring class, the children in that class will be able to wear non uniform on Friday 25 April.

Please can you support your child with completing Times Table Rock Stars each night. It is also important the children complete a soundcheck at least twice a week so we can track areas the children need support in.

Coming up in speedy maths (*indicates new learning):

In science this week, we will be considering what volume is. How do you increase the volume of a sound and what would happen if every sound had the same volume?

In PSHE, the children will finish their work relating to the healthy me jigsaw piece. In this lesson, the children will consider what is right and wrong relating to different friendship situations.

In RE, the children will conclude their current study of Hinduism by considering the factors which help Hindus to worship.

In history, we will be completing our enquiry question. Children will consider how people's lives changed as a result of World War II.

A big thank you to all our parents and carers for your support with your children's learning this term. There is no homework set over the holidays, but please continue to encourage daily reading and times table practice.

We are so proud of the progress your children are making and the values they are developing.

In English, we will be editing and improving our independent writing from last week, using our CUPS and ARMS strategies. We will be looking at two new balanced arguments and we will be debating these topics in class. We will be practising our persuasive skills as well as being respectful to our peers. In reading, we will be finishing our book 'Coming to England'. We will be creating a book review based on our own opinion of the story.

The children will be having a spelling quiz on Tuesday 22.4.25 on these words:

In maths, we will be moving onto geometry. We will begin with understanding and using degrees, classifying and estimating angles then measuring angles up to 180°. We will be using protractors and understanding which side to use to get an accurate measure.

In science, we will be investigating how we can recover solids from a solution. We will perform simple experiments to determine efficient methods of separation.

In history, we will be discovering how the Windrush Generation's contributions are now widely recognised and celebrated in Britain. We will look at the way the National Windrush Monument in Waterloo Station and the annual Windrush Day commemorate those who came on the Empire Windrush and their impact on British society.

In computing, we will finish making our own computer games and evaluate them against our success criteria.
