Nursery School Uniform

Please remember that nursery children do not wear cardigans or summer dresses. They can wear shorts when it is hot but they must be black. All shoes must also be black.

Black trousers, shorts, skirts, leggings, tracksuit bottoms (no denim, cord):

- Skirts should be worn with black tights and only if your child can go to the toilet independently when wearing them
 - Trousers, shorts, leggings and tracksuit bottoms should be worn with black ankle socks
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Appropriate trainers or shoes:

- No heels, open toes, strappy sandals, crocs, jelly shoes, boots or trainers
 - Please, no laces until your child can tie them independently
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Helpful Hints

Children and sun protection – advice from the NHS

Take extra care to protect babies and children. Their skin is much more sensitive than adult skin, and damage caused by repeated exposure to sunlight could lead to skin cancer developing in later life.

From March to October in the UK, children should:

- cover up with suitable clothing
- spend time in the shade, particularly from 11am to 3pm
- wear at least SPF30 sunscreen

Apply sunscreen to areas not protected by clothing, such as the face, ears, feet and backs of hands. We monitor the children's exposure to the sun when in nursery. At the hottest points in the day we stay in the shade and make sure they have lots to drink. Please make sure sun cream is always applied before school.
