This week in maths, we'll be focusing on consolidating our learning from the year so far. The children will revisit key skills such as number bonds to 10 and 20, counting in 2s, 5s, and 10s, simple addition and subtraction, and recognising coins. We'll use fun games, practical activities, and problem-solving tasks to help strengthen their understanding and build confidence. This is a great opportunity to celebrate how much progress they've made this year!

In computing, we will wrap up our work on giving and following instructions. After learning how to sequence the steps to make chocolate crispy cakes and jelly, we will be writing our own set of instructions that could be included in a Year 1 recipe book. Maybe you could make some at home!

In art, we will be putting the final touches on to our sculptures, ready to show them off to you on Friday 11 July at the Welcome to Year 2 Parent Meeting. We are so excited for you to see how much effort and resilience we have used creating these!

In PE we will be continuing to work on our team building skills. We will be developing our communication and cooperation skills within our new Year 2 classes, so that we feel confident going into the new academic year.

In science, we will be examining our brilliant bodies, thinking about the role each part has to play from our head to arms, our legs to our toes. Singing songs will help us to remember which body parts are located where! This science unit of work does NOT include private body parts.

On Friday 18 July, the children will be bringing home all of their books and work from Year 1. Please could you provide your child with a **strong** carrier bag to put this in. **Please also put your child's name on the carrier bag.** Thank you.



In English this week, we will be learning about the style of poetry called a kenning. We will learn how to write our own. A kenning is a type of riddle to describe something without saying what it is. Each line only has 2 two words, the words are joined by a hyphen.

In reading, we will be continuing the book 'Too Small Tola' by Atinuke. We will be practising how to read fluently and highlighting punctuation in the text that will help us to read with expression. We will be thinking about where the story is set and discussing the different expression to use for each character.

The spelling quiz assignment will be set on Tuesday. This week's assignment will be to spell words with apostrophes for contraction, for example can't, it's, didn't, wasn't, I'll, hasn't, doesn't, she'd, couldn't, mustn't.

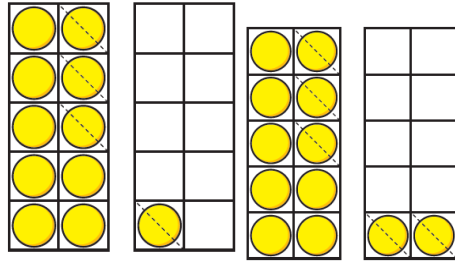

In maths this week, we will be continuing our unit on statistics. We will be exploring block diagrams and pictograms.

In science this week, we will be learning about offspring. We will know that all living things reproduce; that an offspring means the baby of a living; that the offspring of animals have different names - chickens have chicks, bears have cubs, deer have fawns, sheep have lambs, humans have babies, plants have seedlings and lastly that offspring grow into adults that look like their parents

In PSHE this week, we will continue to explore this half terms theme 'Dreams and Goals.' We will talk about and share the successes that we have achieved with other people this half term. We will talk about how contributing to the success of a group feels and share these feelings.

In Zones of Regulation, the children will be continuing to discuss what zone they anticipate experiencing for a variety of different scenarios, and talking about their experiences. We will talk about how all the zones are expected under different circumstances, and it is ok to experience all of them. This activity will help the children to understand how different experiences affect the zone they are in.

In English this week, we will be writing our final free verse poem. We are going to be thinking about all that we have learned and practised to plan and write our own poems about something special to them. In the wider curriculum, in science we will investigate how shadows are formed. We'll be learning about the meaning of opaque, transparent and translucent and will test different objects to see how much light they allow to pass through. We'll compare how some objects create dark and clear shadows, some create fuzzy and light shadows and how some objects don't create any shadow at all.

In art, we will continue our final watercolour painting ahead of our exhibition next week.

In geography, we'll learn about responsible trading and what Fair Trade practice might look like, such as crop rotation, safe working conditions, staff treated fairly etc.

In English this week, the children will begin an independent writing assessment based on their visit to High Ashurst.

In reading, the children will continue *The Missing Diamonds*, by Annabelle Sami, with a focus this week on inference based on evidence in the text.

This week, the children will learn about the different properties of angles and use this knowledge to order them. As well as this, the children will learn about different triangles, polygons and quadrilaterals.

In science this week, we will be learning about how to look after our teeth. We will be using our

recent visit from the dentist to help us with our learning!

In PSHE, we will be considering the steps we would need to take to achieve our goals in life. We will think about how manageable these steps are and how others can support us.

In DT, the children will begin the construction of their cam toys. They will think about how to ensure their moving parts are secure and allow the toy to move.

In RE, we will consider if and how people can work together to change the world.
