Role Description
PTA Class Representative

This post is for one-year term only and a co model can be adopted so the role is shared.

Key Responsibilities:

1. Set up a Class Reps only group for each year group, so class Reps from each class can confer.
2. Set up group contact list when classes are mixed and maintain it in other years.
3. Awareness of GDPR and the WhatsApp guidelines.
4. Organise a rota for a stall/ game at the Christmas Fair.
5. Where possible, attend Class Rep coffee mornings.
6. Organise socials and collections as required.
7. Pass on messages from school in a timely manner.
8. Be responsible for individual staff 'Thank You' collections and contributing to the central staff collections.
9. Share useful reminders e.g. completing Google Forms or when PCTC bookings are open.
10. Should a breach of the 'WhatsApp rules/guidelines' occur, Class Reps should use the following generic message: As the conversation above is not related to the PTA or school messages, any further comments will be deleted. This message is generic and will be used by all Class Reps if necessary.

Messages

If your child is going in to Y3 in September.

Please note, from September, you will need to pay for school meals as your child is no longer eligible for the government's Universal Free School Meal scheme. The only exception to this is if your child is entitled to Free School Meals through being eligible for Pupil Premium. If

you think that this may apply to you, please email parents@stamford-green.surrey.sch.uk

You will need to pay in advance for the lunches before you are able to book them.

If your child is going in to Y6 in September.

There is no set age when children are ready to walk to school or home on their own. It very much depends on their maturity, confidence and any hazards between home and school. Parents/ carers need to decide whether their child is ready for the responsibility. If you decide that, from September, your child is able to leave the school unsupervised, then you must complete the Walking to and from School Alone [Google Form](#) by 3 September.

I liked the water park it had lots of water shooting up from the floor. My favourite animal was the flamingo. - Dylan K

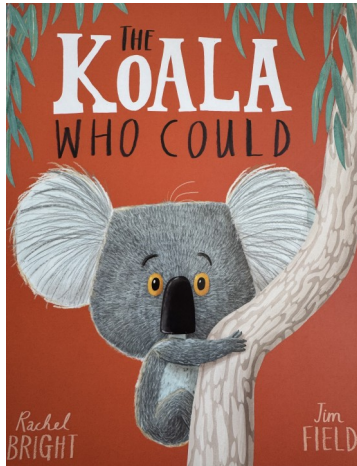
