## **Handy hints**

### **When is my child ready for toilet training?**

When toilet training your child, it is always a good idea to wait until your child shows signs of readiness before starting the process.

Here are some common signs that your child is ready to be trained:

- They show an interest in learning to use the toilet.
- They can walk and sit independently for short periods.
- They can verbalise and understand toilet concepts, such as when they need to go.
- They have started to dislike wearing a nappy.
- They can make the connection between feeling the urge to go and using the toilet.
- They can follow simple instructions and can copy simple bathroom habits.
- They can keep a nappy dry for about 2 hours.
- They can sit on a potty and stay on the toilet long enough to wee or poo.
- They can pull their pants up or down on their own.

If your child shows most of these signs, they are probably ready to be trained.

We work in partnership with parents on toilet training so please speak to us when you are thinking about starting to train your child.

### **Coming up...**

We are pleased to let you know that your child will soon begin bringing a book home from Nursery to enjoy at home. We kindly ask that you record your child's reading in their Learning Journal and please return the book back to school so that they can replace it with another.

While we share many wonderful stories at school, daily reading at home plays a vital role in your child's development. It helps to expand their vocabulary, spark their imagination, build their concentration, and nurture a special bond between you and your child.
