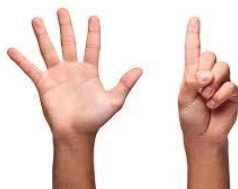
This week we are:

Word Aware

Each week we introduce the children to some new words and use them in lots of different contexts to really deepen their understanding. Below are some ways you can support and reinforce this learning at home.

This weeks concept words:

Cygnets

This week's concept word is: **dry**.

You could let the children help you to hang out the laundry or load the tumble dryer. Talk about the clothes being **not dry**. Then ask the children to feel the clothes when they are **dry**.

Swans

This week's concept word is:

Compare your hands with the children's hands. Talk about whose are **small**.
Cut a sandwich into **small** pieces and talk about **small**.
