Bedtime stories

Please continue to share books every day. Bedtime stories are really valuable to developing your child's vocabulary and speaking and listening skills.

The children start the new term with new carpet spots and new groups. Ask your child which group they are in. The group names are: Squares, Triangles, Rectangles, Ovals, Pentagons and Circles.

Miss Ocraft is very excited to be teaching RP this term and next. She enjoyed getting to know the children and the Reception routines towards the end of last term when she spent lots of time alongside Miss Poole. We're very happy to warmly welcome her as part of the Reception team.



Learning Question of the week: What would YOU choose?

This term's learning begins with thinking '**All About Me**'. We will focus on the book 'You Choose' by Pippa Goodhart. The children will be thinking about making their own choices and being able to give reasons for them. We will look in detail at various sections of the book including, vehicles, clothing and food. Our writing focus will include using descriptive detail when talking about the things that we have chosen, e.g. It is not just a car, but a *big* car with *4* wheels. We will also be designing our own outfits based on our choices of clothing and colours/ patterns. We will be using joining techniques to make vehicles using junk modelling.

If you have any small items we can use for this activity such as tissue boxes, butter tubs, milk bottle lids, please send these in with your child this week. Many thanks!

From our Early Years curriculum the key skills we will focus on are:

- Add detail using descriptive words and phrases in order to be specific.
- Blend sounds to read words.
- Spell words by identifying the sounds and writing the sound (Fred Fingers).
- Know techniques for joining materials including tape and different types of glue.
- Walk along narrow raised beams and spaces.
- Use scissors to cut curved and wavy lines.
- Recognise ways in which we are the same and different.
- Notice and talk about some differences and similarities in familiar objects from the past (e.g. vehicles, toys, clothes etc).

Phonics

We're very excited to begin in our new Read Write Inc groups this week. Look out for information about what your child will be learning and practicing this half term. It will be in their book pack with their new reading materials on Friday.

Lots of children will begin learning 'special friends' this term. These are sounds that are made by more than one letter such as 'ch' or 'sh'.

When we read these, we don't say the individual sounds, but we look for the special friend before we read. You can prompt by saying:

Special friends, fred talk, read the word.

Concept Word

This week's concept word is: **Both**



Help your child at home: Ask, 'If there are two people and only one biscuit, what should you do?' Share some food that can be cut or broken in half, eg apples or biscuits. Make sure that each of you has half. What if there is a bag of sweets? How can we make sure each of us have half?

Reading

Some words we learn to read are called '**red**' words. These are words that are not decodable using our usual 'Fred Talk' method. We need to learn these by sight. We will be introducing new 'red' words each week and will put a sticker in your child's Learning Journal to let you know what they are. Please practice recognising these words at home.

They are words that you will often see in books.

This week's red word is:

your

Red words we have covered so far:

I, my, the, you, said

Maths

In maths we will deepen our knowledge of '**more than**' and '**less than**' when comparing two amounts. We aim to recognise 'more' and 'less' when looking at organised objects, un-organised objects and digits (i.e without counting). We will also record our understanding in different ways such as using counters, writing digits on whiteboards or holding a number fan. We continue to have our daily maths meetings and this week's 2D shape is the **triangle**.

Less means a **smaller**, or littler amount.

More means a **bigger**, or greater amount.



Equal means **the same amount**
