If you are looking for some things to do over the Easter break, here are some suggestions:

<b>Easter Cards:</b> Design and make Easter cards for a family member.	<b>Easter Sensory Walk:</b> Go outside and focus on smells, sights and sounds of spring.	<b>Egg Rolling/Races:</b> Create ramps from cardboard boxes for racing eggs.
<b>Cooking:</b> Encourage your child to help prepare or make a dish. Be sure to take photos to share with us!	<b>Bunny Hop Races:</b> Hop like bunnies to a finish line. You can add a number challenge by asking them to hop to specific numbered spots.	<b>Egg and Spoon Race:</b> Use a large ladle instead of a spoon for younger children to make it less challenging.
<b>Library:</b> Take a visit to your local library. Can you find any books about seasons or bunnies?	<b>Easter Biscuits:</b> Let toddlers help with mixing and cutting out bunny or egg shapes.	<b>Easter Playdough:</b> Use yellow dough with feathers, googly eyes, and pipe cleaners to build dough chicks.
<b>Storytelling Circles:</b> Sit in a circle and co-create a story. Each family member adds another part to the story. It could get very silly!	<b>Role Play:</b> Set up themed spaces (shop, doctor, kitchen or space station etc). Encourage children to take on roles and talk in character.	<b>Meeting up with friends in the park:</b> Practise climbing, balancing, hopping and jumping whilst having fun with friends.
