Dear Families,

Y4 High Ashurst Residential – Wednesday 1 July to Friday 3 July

In preparation for the forthcoming residential to High Ashurst please can you complete the medical requirement [Google Form](#) for children attending the residential. This will ensure that all aspects of care for your child have been covered and will be clear for staff when preparing for the residential. There is also a section to complete, to let staff know if we have permission to administer Calpol and/or Piriton, should it be required. We will always let you know if it has been given to them.

We already hold information about pupils' dietary requirements, including food allergies so there is no need for you to tell us this again. If you would like to update any information we hold, please contact Mrs Ravago in the school office. parents@stamford-green.surrey.sch.uk

We would be grateful if you could complete the Google Form no later than 9.00am on Monday 1 June 2026. It is essential that we have this information to share with staff attending the residential and members of the High Ashurst team. Please be assured that this information will remain confidential.

On the day of departure, all medicines should be clearly named and labelled and handed to Miss Croucher, at the East Gate, who will be overseeing the administration of medicines during the week.

Please also find enclosed the kit/packing list, which we hope you will find useful. On the day of departure, children should not wear school uniform. They should be dressed ready to participate in the activities at High Ashurst (please see attached kit list). Accompanying the children on the trip will be the following members of staff: Miss Croucher, Mr Vidal, Mrs Beadle, Mrs Anderson, Mrs Bevan, Mr Osborne, Mrs Kellett, Miss Julia Jenkins and Mrs Herman. We will have the school's duty phone with us (07874 046602) but this should only be used if there's an exceptional emergency.

The tepees are arranged in a small 'village', which sleep a maximum of eight children. Staff will group the children after being asked to list five children from their class that they would like to share with. We will guarantee one of those children to be with them. There will be different groups of nine or ten for the daytime activities. This ensures they are with a variety of children during the residential.

The children will need to have a packed lunch and water bottle for the day of departure. This should be brought in a carrier/plastic bag that can be disposed of after they have eaten. Alternatively, you can book a packed lunch from Accent, for the day of departure. If your child would like a school packed lunch, please make sure you book this by Friday 19 June.

Digital devices/trackers

Please note that children are not permitted to bring any electronic gadgets on the trip. This includes mobile phones, trackers, tablets or smart watches. We would appreciate your support in enforcing this. Any devices that are brought on to the trip will be confiscated, turned off or disabled and handed back to adults when we arrive back at school.

On the day that we return to school, children will be dismissed at the end of the day as usual. Please allow time to look through any lost property at the end of the day before you leave.

We will take one photograph each day to share on the school's Instagram account for those children that have permission to be on social media. You can update permissions on the photo, film and video consent form on the school [website](#).

We are all looking forward to our trip away and please do not hesitate to contact us if we can help in any way before we depart.

Kit/Packing List

We have included a summary of the kit that the children will need to bring with them. Please note that children will not be provided with a sleeping bag at the centre and that the residential representative has advised that children should bring a good quality/durable (2/3 season) sleeping bag and a roll mat to lie on in the teepees. Children are also welcome to bring their own small pillow.

- Please pack plenty of warm clothing in case of wet/cold weather despite it being July!
- All activities will continue, if possible, even in wet conditions.
- Clothing should be old and suitable for outdoor activities/camping.
- All clothes should be organised into daily plastic bags with everything that they require for that day.
- All clothing should be clearly labelled with your child's name on.

- Warm nightwear (tracksuit bottoms and a sweatshirt - weather depending) **No onesies please**
- Each daily plastic bag should contain:
 - Underwear
 - Socks (not trainer socks)
 - T-shirt/ polo tops (no vest tops)
 - Old trousers or long shorts (the children cannot wear a harness over short shorts!)

In addition, they will require:

- 2 or more fleeces/sweatshirts
- 2 pair of trainers (in case 1 pair gets wet)
- **Waterproof jacket (not just showerproof) This is essential**
- Waterproof trousers (if possible)
- Small pillow
- 2/3 season sleeping bag (wrapped in waterproof bag/durable dustbin liner)
- Roll mat (no inflatable airbeds please)
- Small holdall/small suitcase which must zip up (no loose items)
- Sun hat/cap
- **Wellington boots (these are essential)**
- Wash bag (soap, toothbrush, etc.)
- 1 small towel
- 3 extra labelled plastic bags/bin liner for wet, dirty clothes
- Pen and paper/book to read if wanted
- 1 packet of sweets to be pooled, held centrally by staff
- Sun cream
- Torch/ head torch with name on
- **Water bottle with name on**
- Packed lunch for the first day in disposable containers/bags (no nuts/ fizzy drinks/ glass bottles/cans/flavoured water) if not booked on Select

Everything should be packed into a bin liner within a holdall/suitcase, in case bags are caught outside in the rain.

If your child helps you to pack, they will be able to find everything when they arrive.

Hopefully, bedding will also fit in the holdall/suitcase but if it doesn't fit then it needs to be in a durable waterproof bag.

The children will be expected to carry their bags to the teepee so a practice might be useful.

It is helpful to pack all the clothes for each day in separate plastic bags.

Please note children must not bring valuables, electronic equipment, phones or money on this residential.

Finally, don't forget to name label everything!
