### Academic Year Transition/SEND Coffee Morning

We invite families of children with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) to join us for a supportive networking coffee morning.

We will be focusing on supporting children through the transition into the new academic year.

#### Zones of Regulation

This week, we will be focusing on the Blue Zone and how we can support each other. We will help the children recognise when they may be feeling tired, sad, or low in energy, and explore kind and supportive ways to respond to others who may be in this zone. This will include encouraging empathy, noticing how others feel, and thinking about small ways we can help each other feel better.

#### Values

Our Club Room value this week is friendship and team building. We will be encouraging the children to work together, build positive relationships, and support one another through shared activities. This will help strengthen a sense of belonging and cooperation within the group.

#### Learning

Our learning aims for the children this week are as follows:

In the EYFS and Key Stage 1, we will be focusing on developing their speaking and sentence-building skills using Colourful Semantics. This will support them in structuring sentences and answering questions about pictures, helping to build confidence with communication in a clear and supported way.

In Key Stage 2, the children will continue with bespoke Maths and English learning, tailored to their individual needs and next steps, ensuring they are appropriately supported and challenged. Across the provision, we will continue our work on celebrating differences, helping children to understand prejudice and discrimination in an age-appropriate way. We will support pupils to develop respect for others and recognise the importance of kindness and inclusion.
