Here are the rest of the Read, Write, Inc. sounds in this phase that will be covered when your child moves up to Reception. There is no expectation that your child should know these when they enter Reception as they will start again from the beginning. However, it is a great idea to encourage your child to form the letters of their name correctly. Being able to label drawings with their name will give them a real sense of independence.

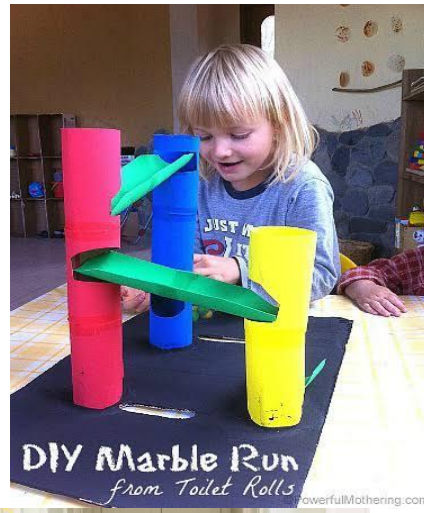
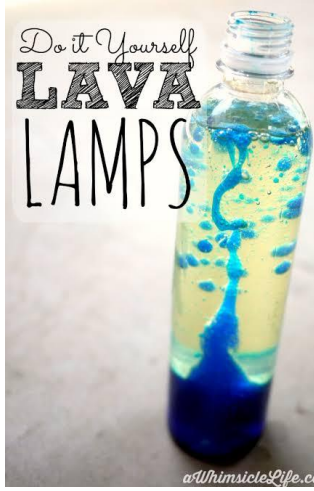
For example,

Over the summer we would encourage you to play lots of listening games to help your child with their phonological awareness. Eye spy is a great game for identifying the sounds at the start of words. Orally blending sounds together (such as m – a – p = map) will also support your child's development.
