In maths this week, we will be finishing our unit on statistics. We will be exploring drawing and interpreting pictograms.

In geography this week, we will be answering the question 'Could a polar bear live in the desert?' We will be reviewing all of our learning this half term in order to answer this question.

In science, we will be learning about Maria Sibylla Merian, a pioneering naturalist, scientist, and artist who is best known for her detailed studies of insects and plants. At a time when little was understood about insect life cycles, she carefully observed and illustrated how caterpillars transform into butterflies and moths, helping to advance scientific knowledge. We will also be taking a walk on our school grounds to have a look at some microhabitats.

In English this week, we are using the fiction-writing skills that we have been developing throughout the year to write a story. Each day, we will tackle a different part of the story using these pictures as inspiration.

In maths this week, we will be interpreting the data recorded in bar charts. We will then be collecting data to answer questions and recording the data using tally charts. Having collected the data, we will use our bar chart skills to draw charts to represent the information.

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In the wider curriculum, in geography, we will take a learning without limits approach to create posters/fact files/information pages that outline the children's response to the Enquiry Question 'Where does our food come from?'

In DT, we will evaluate our healthy product, thinking carefully about whether we would make any further changes. We may also have time to think about how to design a package for our healthy dip.

In English this week, the children will be writing their own poems in a style of their choice. Later in the week, the children will be taking performance inspiration from Michael Rosen when sharing their poems with the rest of the class.

We will finish reading The Firework Maker's Daughter and follow Lila as her adventure reaches its exciting conclusion, summarise the key events from the story and reflect on the characters, themes and the lessons they have learned throughout the book.

There will not be a Spelling Quiz for the children next week.

In maths this week, we will be learning about angles and shapes. We will identify and understand different types of angles before comparing and ordering them by size. We will also explore the properties of different triangles and quadrilaterals, using what we know to identify and sort shapes based on their features.

Coming up in Speedy Maths (*indicates new learning):

w/b 13.7.26	Know all tables to 12x12, including division facts at speed. Add three tens at speed. Use tables to work out related $\times$ and $\div$ at speed.
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In DT, the children will be finishing their cam toys. They will be thinking about how to create the mechanism and add it to their design.

In PSHE, we will be reflecting on our fantastic year together.

In history, we will be comparing the different civilisations we have studied this half term.

In maths, we will be learning about timetables; capacity, how to estimate capacity and how it differs to volume. Children will learn to measure in millilitres and litres.
