

Read Write Inc. Phonics and Fresh Start

- Children learning to read in YR-Y2
- Older children who need to 'catch up'
- Fresh Start Year 5 and Year 6
- Taught in groups based on their stage of reading

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English alphabetic code

- 44 sounds
- 26 letters
- Over 150+ graphemes (letter combinations)
- One of the most complex alphabetic codes in the world.

How do we teach the children to read and write?

- Homogenous groups that are regularly assessed to suit the children's needs.
- 9 groups across the year group taught by Teachers and Teaching Assistants.
- All rooms have been set up with the same resources for the sessions.

Speed Sounds sessions

- Teaching of a new letter or digraph (special friend)
- Children learn a picture phrase to help learn the sound.
- Practise reading words with the new sound in
- Review reading words with sounds previously learnt
- Practise writing words with the associated sound
- Final review
