Year 1 Weekly Information w/b 11.2.19

This week in English we will be putting a twist on the Traditional Tale 'The Three Little Pigs'. We will be focusing on 'The True Story of The Three Little Pigs' by Jon Scieszka. We will be continuing to use role-play and story maps to help us gain a deeper understanding of the story. We will think how there are often two sides or more to a story. We will apply this to what happens on the playground. We will also be retelling the story in our own words later on in the week.

In maths this week we will be carrying out open ended investigations. We will be using our knowledge of place value and number bonds to help us. We will do this independently and in a team. We will also continue to practise our numbers at speed during speedy maths!

Our half termly spelling test will be happening this week, so make sure you keep on practising!

1W had a fantastic time at the Synagogue last week. Thank you so much to the volunteers. We

couldn't have done it without you! Also a big thank you to 1B and 1G's volunteers. We can't wait to attend this Wednesday and Thursday. In English this week, we will be having a grammar focus. We will be assessing how much we have improved with our spelling, punctuation and grammar and seeing if we can get our best score so far on our Grammar Hammer!

In maths lessons this week, we will be beginning to look at subtraction. We will be focusing on subtracting a one-digit number from a two-digit number. There will be lots of opportunities for practical learning and we will be using the tens frames and cubes to support our understanding.

Year 3 Weekly Information w/b 11.2.19

In English this week, the children will be writing their own Viking sagas. They are going to be thinking about the different characters they have become familiar with and make decisions about the opening to their story so that it hooks the reader. Will they choose to write an opening that starts with description, action, a question or dialogue?

In maths, the children will be continuing to develop their skill at telling the time. Children who are confident with telling the time are going to be working on reading timetables, making sure they can read them accurately and use them to work out how long an event takes or calculate start and end times of an activity.

Coming up soon in speedy maths:

Our themed learning this week will focus on life at home for the Vikings who settled in the UK. The children will investigate how Vikings dressed. We will be making our own Viking clothing from paper, so we kindly ask if children could bring in any Barbie doll/action men type toys they have to help model their work on. In maths this week, we are looking at how to subtract fractions from whole numbers. We will also be using our problems solving skills to undertake a maths investigation.

Year 5 Weekly Information w/b 11.2.19

In English this week, 5B will be working on their assembly. Both classes will also be looking at the reading assessments that we completed last week. We will get the opportunity to explore our answers and see what would have made our answers even better. We will once again be focusing on skills of retrieval and inference, as well as ensuring that we use evidence from a text to support our responses.

In maths, we will also be exploring questions from the recent assessment. We will get the chance to consider our responses. We will also look at whether there are strategies that could have been employed to help answer some of the questions.

In speedy maths this week, we will be covering the following areas:

On Wednesday, we will have all the excitement of a visit from Space Dome. We will be able to study the stars and witness clever demonstrations of how the universe and solar system work!

This week's times tables test will focus on the 8x table. As well as related division facts, we will include squared and cubed numbers, so these remain fresh in our minds. The final five questions in the test will be taken from any table. For our spelling test, we will continue with the next five words (lightning to opportunity).

Finally, a kind parent has let us know that their child has had headlice. Please could you check your child's hair and treat any eggs or lice found, thank you.

Year 6 Weekly Information w/b 11.2.19

In English this week, we will be revising adverbial phrases and answering inference questions using PEE (point, evidence and explanation). Our spelling test will be five words from last week's spelling rule - suffixes which all make the 'shun' sound.

- The suffix -tion means 'the act of'. For instance, digestion means 'the act of digesting'.
- The suffix -sion means 'the result of'. For example, impression means the 'result of impressing'.
- The suffix -sion means 'the state of'. For example, conclusion means the 'result of concluding'.
- The suffix -cian is often a word that describes an occupation.

In maths, we will be revising written methods needed for arithmetic and continuing our work on algebra.

Please note that we will be sending PE kits and trainers home on Friday. Please could we ask for the trainers to be washed too as the Year 6 classrooms are not smelling as good as they used to! Thank you for your support with this.
