Year 1 Weekly Information w/b 4.2.19

We are continuing our English project on Traditional Tales this week. Last week we enjoyed reading many stories and acting out and writing the Three Little Pigs. This week we will be continuing with this and completing role-play and writing based on The Little Red Hen. We have shared lots of lovely books that the children have brought in and they are more than welcome to continue this over the next couple weeks, however please ensure they are named in order for them to be returned.

In maths this week we will be focusing on telling the time. We will be introducing o'clock, half past and beginning to discuss quarter past and quarter to. We will be using the terms minutes and hours. The children will have the opportunity to look at a variety of times including digital. If the children have a small analogue watch they may wear this to school.

Our half termly spelling test will be happening next week, so keep on practising!

Tuesday is Safer Internet Day and a mufiti day, so we will re-visit and discuss keeping safe online following on from our lessons earlier this term.

The children in 1W will be attending the Synagogue this week (1B and 1G will be attending next week although this information does apply to them too!) to support their learning about Judaism. The Synagogue have asked if boys can bring a hat on the day they are visiting (a cap or sun hat is acceptable). This is only a request and the Synagogue will not enforce the wearing of a hat however as a mark of respect for different faiths we feel it is important to encourage the child to do so.

Thank you so much to the volunteers who are attending the trip. For 1W there was a sticker in the Learning Journals last week in regards to this. 1G and 1B will have helper stickers in their Learning Journals by the end of the week. If you have volunteered to help via Tucasi you will be needed to attend with the class you volunteered for, as we had the right amount we did not need to do a lucky dip!

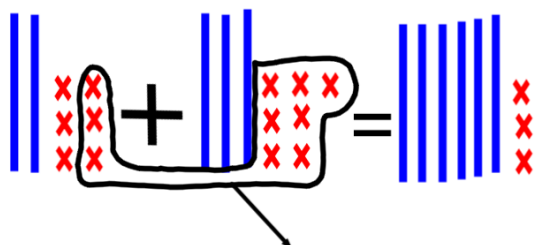
Year 2 Weekly Information w/b 4.2.19

Next week, we will be using our recent science knowledge on materials to design and make a boat. Please can you send in a small plastic tub that you don't mind not getting back again e.g. a takeaway container, margarine tub, ice cream tub by Tuesday 12 February. Thanks for your support.

In English this week we will be using our Life at Sea themed learning as a stimulus for some descriptive writing. The children will be challenged to correctly use a range of descriptive devices in their writing such as adjectives, expanded noun phrases, adverbs and alliteration. We will be really focussing on using our senses to inspire our writing and using clips from Disney's Moana in order to provide us with exciting characters and settings.

In maths lessons this week, we will be continuing with two-digit + two-digit number sentences. We will be using a variety of methods, including using dienes, sticks and crosses, number lines and the partitioning method. This week all of our number sentences will involve an exchange with the ones digits.

Year 3 Weekly Information w/b 4.2.19

This week in Year 3, the children will be continuing to work on their persuasive writing. In the last few weeks, we have written persuasively about school and local issues and this week the children are going to explore a wider concern and write persuasively about single use plastics.

In maths, we will be working on telling the time. Monday's lesson was focused on finding out the children's current confidence with telling the time. For the remainder of the week, the children will be developing their skills – this could be telling the time using o'clock and half past; quarter to and quarter past; telling the time to the nearest five minutes; telling the time to the nearest minute; using the 24 hour clock; or finding intervals of time.

In our themed learning, the children are going to explore a third Viking saga and investigate the roles of men, women and children during Viking times. In science, the children are going to make guides that clearly explain what happens when two magnets meet. They will be using the magnets to test out different combinations of North and South poles meeting on two magnets. Will their tests support what they already know?

On Tuesday our work is linking in with Safer Internet Day and, during the week, the children will also be spending some time on an art activity for 'No Tech For Breck', when we will not be using any computing technology throughout the lesson.

In English, we will be having a grammar focus. We will be learning how to use the possessive apostrophe correctly.

In maths this week, the children will be using the Charity Soup Kitchen event as the starting point for problem solving activities. We will also be consolidating all we have learnt this term with a maths summary of learning. Next half term we will be looking at time. Please could you help your child to tell the time to the nearest minute using an analogue clock.

In English this week, we will build on last week's work on recounts, where we looked at the features and grammar involved. We will be writing our own recounts of Young Voices at the O2. Later in the week, we will be focusing on our reading skills – retrieval and inference – ensuring we use evidence from a text to support our responses.

In the afternoon, we will not be using any technology – this is in accordance with 'No tech 4 Breck', which is being recognised across the school.

As we didn't have any tests last Friday, this week's times tables test will focus on the $7x$ table. As well as related division facts, we will include squared and cubed numbers, so these remain fresh in our minds. The final five questions in the test will be taken from any table. For our spelling test, we will continue with the next five words (identity-language).

**Year 6 Weekly Information w/b 4.2.19**

First, we would like to say how proud we are of all the children after last week – they all tried their hardest with their practice National Curriculum tests and showed resilience. When we gave them their papers back, they were keen to reflect on what they did well and what areas they could improve on. We are pleased with their positive 'can do' attitude.

In English this week, we will be learning the eight parts of speech (nouns, adjectives, adverbs, conjunctions, interjections/exclamation, pronouns, verbs and prepositions) and identifying these in writing.

The spelling rules this week will be suffixes which all make the 'shun' sound.

- The suffix $-tion$ means 'the act of'. For instance, digestion means 'the act of digesting'.
- The suffix $-sion$ means 'the result of'. For example, impression means the 'result of impressing'.
- The suffix $-sion$ means 'the state of'. For example, conclusion means the 'result of concluding'.
- The suffix $-cian$ is often a word that describes an occupation.

In maths, we will be starting work on algebra. We will be looking at function machines and then moving onto more formal algebraic functions.

On Tuesday, we will be celebrating Chinese New Year by making decorations, spring rolls and performing our dragon dances to our peers. In order to chop the vegetables for our spring rolls, please could your child bring in a chopping board. As well as celebrating Chinese New Year, we will be researching terracotta warriors in theme. We will then design our own ready to create our warrior next week.

As part of Safer Internet Day, we will be designing an emoji that will give advice on how to stay safe online.

Finally, on Tuesday 12 February, we have the PTA Cushion Club for Year 6. Don't forget to sign up by midday on Friday, via PTA Events, if your child would like to go.
