### **Year 1 Weekly Information w/b 8.10.18**

We will continue to think about the stories of Jane Hissey this week. We will be making up our own stories with some of her characters such as Old Bear, Bramwell Brown, Jolly Tall and Little Bear. As well as telling stories to each other, we will write some stories as a class and on our own. We will also begin to think about how to plan a story.

In maths we will be looking at number facts. This includes number bonds to 10 (ways of making 10). We will be using our fingers, number frames and bead strings to help reinforce ways of making 10. At home questions to try would be e.g. We have 4 apples how many more would make 10, We have 5 sausages what would we need to make 10 etc.

This week in speedy maths we will be counting quickly and accurately using pictures and rehearsing number formation. We will also be writing missing numbers. The children will be checking that they have written the numbers round the right way.

The Golden Books will come home this week. Please fill in the sticker on the summary page. The children have worked really hard and they will love to hear your positive comments! Please return to school when you have enjoyed looking at your child's learning and filled in the sticker.

Next week will be 'The Great Harvest Bake Off'. Year 1 children will be making 'Gruffalo Pies' (edible ones!) – Requests for ingredients will be sent home on a label in each child's Learning Journal by Thursday of this week – Please can the ingredients be brought in on Wednesday 17 October as we will be making our 'pies' on this day!

## Year 2 Weekly Information w/b 8.10.18

A reminder of the schedule for Pedals training sessions this week:

The children will need to walk their bikes/scooters to the ball cage from either the West or East gates and lock them to the fence if they have a lock they can operate themselves. A member of the Y2 team will be in the ball cage to help.

Golden Books will be coming home this week so that you can see what your child has been learning about in class. Please look through the Golden Book with your child and complete the sticker at the end of the week's work with a positive comment. When you're done with the Golden Book, please return to school for safe keeping.

In English this week, we will be assessing the children's reading skills as they tackle their first written comprehension task. We will be teaching the children to following strategy which will be practised throughout the rest of Year 2 to allow the children to demonstrate their understanding of what they have read:

1. Read the questions
2. Read the text
3. Whilst reading, underline pieces of evidence
4. Answer the questions using underlined evidence from the text

In maths we are applying our knowledge of place value and number. We will be using '>' (more than), '<' (less than) and '=' (equals) to compare numbers in a game of Top Trumps. We will also be working together to put numbers into a sequence from lowest to highest.

w/b 15.10.1 8	*Know 2x table at speed Add 10 at speed Know number facts to 20 at speed Subtract 10 at speed Know doubles to 20 Know pairs of 10s to 100 Count on in 2s Add 1 digit numbers at speed

Here's the basic recipe and equipment the groups will need for the children's orange biscuits that they will be making and then selling at the bake sale next Friday.

- 300g self raising flour
- 200g butter
- 100g caster sugar
- 2 large oranges
- Secret Ingredient  
(children to decide!)

- 2 baking trays
- Mixing bowl
- Greaseproof paper
- Airtight container to hold biscuits

Please look out for a sticker in your child's Learning Journal by the end of this week which will be highlighted to indicate what ingredients and equipment your child has chosen to bring. We kindly ask that the ingredients have already been weighed out before being sent into school to save the children time as they have a lot of biscuits to make! We will be baking next Wednesday 17 October, so please send in the highlighted items on that morning. ### Year 3 Weekly Information w/b 8.10.18

In English this week, the children will be thinking about how to make their descriptive writing interesting. Using interesting description is one of our main focuses in Year 3 and the children will be developing a toolkit to use throughout the year. This week we will be describing the area around us and then using a video to write descriptively about a volcano.

In maths this week, we will be working on collecting and representing data. The children are going to be drawing bar charts and will make them more complex by varying the interval on the y axis. They will also be analysing the information in bar graphs so that they can answer questions.

Coming up soon in speedy maths:

w/b 8.10.18	Know 10 less than 3-digit numbers. Know 3x table at speed. Know 2x, 5x 10x tables and related division facts at speed. Double and half numbers to 20 at speed.
w/b 15.10.18	Know 4x table at speed. Know 10 more than 3-digit numbers. Know 10 less than 3-digit numbers. Know addition and subtraction facts to 20. 2x, 5x, 10x tables including division facts.

Our themed learning this week will be investigating different types of rocks, their properties and their uses.

This week, the children will be coming home with a sticker in their Learning Journal saying what they have volunteered to provide for the Great Harvest Bake Off next week. Please check your child's Learning Journal to ensure they have a sticker by the end of this week. In Year 3, we will be making rock cakes by adapting the following basic recipe:

Ingredients: (Makes: 20-30 cakes)

250 grams self raising flour  
200 grams caster sugar  
120 grams unsalted butter  
120 ml semi-skimmed milk

Equipment:

2 large baking trays  
Baking paper for 2 trays  
1 large mixing bowl  
Wooden spoon  
Air tight container (for 20-30 cakes)

Our baking day will be Thursday 18 October 2018.

### Year 4 Weekly Information w/b 8.10.18

In English this week, the children will be writing Greek myths, using their story mountains and including their own mythical characters. We will also be looking at using adverbs and prepositions effectively. Next week we will be testing the children on 20 words from the Y4 spelling list. Please can you support your child in learning these words.

In maths this week, the children will be continuing to work on addition and subtraction. We will be using the bar model approach to help us to unpick word problems.

Coming up soon in speedy maths (\* indicates new learning):

w/b 8.10.18	Know 7x table at speed. Know 9x table at speed. Add and subtract pairs of 2-digit numbers at speed. Know halves and doubles of numbers to 20. Know number bonds to 20.
w/b 15.10.18	*Know 8x table at speed Add and subtract hundreds and 3-digit numbers. Know 2x, 3x, 4x, 5x, 6x, 10x tables and related division facts at speed. Divide any number by 10. Know pairs of numbers to 100.

In our themed learning this week, the children will be using their knowledge of Ancient Greek theatre to make masks. In computing we will continue to be using Scratch to write our own algorithms. Next week the children will be taking part in the Great Harvest Bake Off! In Year 4 we will be making pizzas and the children will be varying the toppings. Year 4 will be making their pizzas on Thursday 18 October, so please can they bring in the required ingredients and equipment on that day (not before please). All equipment should be named.

Please see below for the basic recipe. The exact recipe, with the group's chosen adaptation, along with equipment list, will be included in your child's Learning Journal by Thursday 11 October. Further information regarding the sale will be included in next week's Weekly Information email.

#### Ingredients:

250g plain flour  
1 teaspoon dried active baking yeast  
1 pinch salt  
300ml water  
1 tablespoon olive oil

**Toppings (to be decided by each group)** such as Tomato sauce mozzarella cheese, sliced or grated ham, mushrooms, peppers, olives, as desired

## Equipment

Mixing bowl  
Sieve  
Whisk  
Wooden spoon x 2  
Rolling pin  
Metal spoon  
Cheese grater  
Air-tight container x2 (big enough for 4 pizza slices each)

## Method

- Whisk together the flour, yeast and salt. Stir in the water and olive oil, adding more flour a little at a time if the dough is too sticky. Form the dough into a ball, cover and let the dough rest for 15 minutes.
- Preheat the oven to 200 C / Gas 6. Spread the dough onto a generously floured baking tray.
- Spread the sauce over the pizza base, layer on the mozzarella cheese and add other ingredients as desired.
- Bake in the preheated oven until the pizza base is puffed and golden, about 15 minutes.

## Year 5 Weekly Information w/b 8.10.18

In English, we will be using empathy to describe how someone might be feeling. We will consider our senses and emotions and using descriptive devices to convey the atmosphere.

In maths, we will be focussing on the written method for long multiplication, starting with multiplying 2-digit numbers by 2-digit numbers, i.e.

$$\begin{array}{r} 36 \\ \times 27 \\ \hline 252 \\ 720 \\ \hline 972 \end{array}$$

In speedy maths this week, we will be covering the following areas:

<b>w.b: 8.10.18</b>	Give change from £1 at speed Know pairs of tens to 180 Add three tens at speed. Convert cm to mm and vice versa
<b>w.b: 15.10.18</b>	Add and subtract pairs of 2-digit numbers at speed. Continue simple number patterns Use tables to work out related x and ÷ at speed.

The annual Great Harvest Bake Off is just around the corner. Next week, we will be making flapjacks to sell on the day. Today, we discussed in groups ideas about how we could adapt our basic recipe to make delicious and attractive flapjacks. This is the basic recipe:

### Flapjacks

225g butter  
225g demerara sugar  
75g golden syrup  
275g porridge oats

We will be deciding on a final version that our group will make next Wednesday (17.10.18) and we will be writing in our Learning Journals which ingredients and equipment each of us will need to bring in.

This Friday, we will concentrate on the next five Year 5 words from the back of the Learning Journal (equipment – frequently) and the 6x table. In the times table test, we will demonstrate our knowledge of the table in random order and when we use related division facts, e.g.  $8 \times 6 = 48$ ;  $18 \div 6 = 3$ . If you are looking for something to help with practising times tables at home, 'Hit the Button' is a good online game – <https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games/hit-the-button>.

### Year 6 Weekly Information w/b 8.10.18

This week in English, we will be revising how to use semi colons accurately in our writing. We will be continuing to refine our retrieval and inference skills through our reading of The Hunger Games. On Tuesday we will be testing five words with the suffix -ible/-able and the first ten words from the Year 6 list (which is in the back of the Learning Journal).

In maths, we will be revising the written method for short division and introducing the children to the written method for long division. They will then be applying these methods when solving problems.

#### Long division

Children divide up to 4-digit by 2-digit using Long Division:

$\begin{array}{r} 576 \\ 15 \overline{)8640} \\ \underline{-75} \phantom{0} \\ 114 \phantom{0} \\ \underline{-105} \phantom{0} \\ 90 \end{array}$	<p>15 into 8 doesn't go so look at the next digit. 15 goes into 86 five times so put a 5 above the 6. <b><math>15 \times 5 = 75</math></b> Take away 75 from 86 to get the remainder 11. Carry the 4 down to make 114. 15 goes into 114 seven times so put a 7 above the 4. <b><math>15 \times 7 = 105</math></b> Take away 105 from 114 to get the remainder 9. Carry the 0 down to make 90. 15 goes into 90 exactly 6 times so put a 6 above the 0.</p>
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#### Short division

Children use short division to divide up to 4-digit number by 1-digit.

$\begin{array}{r} 513 \\ 5 \overline{)25615} \end{array}$	<p>5 into 2 doesn't go so look to the next digit. 5 into 25 goes 5 times. Write 5 on the top line. 5 into 6 goes once, remainder 1. Write 1 on the answer line, carry the remainder. 5 into 15 goes 3 times. Write 3 on the top line.</p>
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The Great Harvest Bake Off will be taking place on **Friday 19 October**. This week we will be planning our adapted recipes and the children will be bringing home a list of ingredients and equipment they have volunteered to bring in on **Wednesday 17 October**. ## Recipe

### Basic Ingredients:

100g softened butter

100g caster sugar

2 large eggs

100g self-raising flour

1 level teaspoon baking powder

Makes 12

### Equipment

2 x 12 cake baking tins

Fairy cake cases

Wooden spoon

Metal spoon (for folding in flour)

Bowl in which to mix ingredients

Fork

Small bowl (for beating the eggs in)

Tin/box (to store cakes)

Apron

Kitchen scales

Sieve
