Year 1 Weekly Information w/b 23.9.19

Our author of the week is Jez Alborough. He has written books such as 'Tall', 'Hug' and 'Duck in the Truck'. If you have any Jez Alborough books at home that your child would like to bring in, please don't forget to put their name in the front. We will be finding out about Bobo and his friends and exploring the use of rhyme.

Our focus in maths this week will be one more and one less. We will be focusing on numbers to 30. We will also be using the hundred square to practise counting from a given number. We will be focusing on the mathematical language of more and less and demonstrating our understanding by explaining how we know an answer is correct.

In speedy maths we will be continuing to practise one to one correspondence with counting objects.

This half term children have 20 words to learn for their spelling test of high frequency words. A list of all these words was sent home earlier in the term. You can use this to help them practise reading the words at speed, before learning to spell them. At school we practise these words using 'Look, Say, Cover, Write, Check' daily and during phonic sessions. At the end of each week children will bring these practice sheets home for you to get a feel for which words they need to focus on with you at home.

Please can all children have a named water bottle in school every day – thank you.



Year 2 Weekly Information w/b 23.9.19

In English this week, we will be focusing on planning and writing recounts. We will be going on an Autumn walk and writing about the kinds of things that we experienced using our senses.

In maths, we are continuing exploring different ways of making the same number using the partpart whole model and writing number sentences and dienes (sticks and crosses) to accompany the models.



We are also investigating more complex part-part whole models to calculate missing numbers that form the model. We are using dienes and making numbers and learning to use the correct digits to make that number. Also, we are continuing to explain our reasoning on how we solved the calculations.

Year 3 Weekly Information w/b 23.9.19

In English this week, we will be using our plans to write our own story based on Katie and the Dinosaurs. We will also be reading The Pebble in My Pocket and sequencing the main events from the book.

In maths, we are continuing our place value work. We are ordering numbers up to 1,000, counting in 50s and ordering numbers on a number line. We will finish the week with an investigation.

In PSHER we are thinking about the qualities of friendship. In computing, we will be learning how to resize and reposition pictures on a page.

Year 4 Weekly Information w/b 23.9.19

In English this week, we are focusing on settings for Ancient Greek myths. We will be using a range of descriptive devices to write about our own setting. In grammar we will be starting to unpick the eight parts of speech, focusing on: nouns, verbs, adjectives and adverbs. We will also be looking at how to use evidence from the text to support our answers to comprehension questions.

Our spelling focus this week will continue to be homophones. Homophones are words that sound the same but are spelt differently and have a different meaning e.g. there, their and they're. The children will be writing any homophones that they feel they need to learn for the test next week in their Learning Journal. In addition, we will revise the next five words from the Year 3 spelling list.

In maths we will be continuing to round numbers to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000. We will also be working with negative numbers and focusing on providing proof for our answers.

In speedy maths this week we will be covering (* indicates new learning):

w/c 23.9.19	*Know 9x table at speed Add and subtract pairs of 1-digit and 2-digit numbers Know doubles and halves of tens Know pairs of numbers to 100. Add and subtract 1-digit numbers and 3-digit numbers
w/c 30.9.19	*Know pairs of tens to 90.Know 9x table at speed Know 2x, 3x, 4x, 5x, 6x, 10x tables and related division facts at speed. Add hundreds to 3-digit numbers at speed. Know doubles and halves of tens.

In our themed learning, 'Greece is the Word' this week, we will be singing about the Trojan horse story and creating mazes to represent the Minotaur's Labyrinth using Microsoft Powerpoint. This will allow the children to practise their insertion, copying and pasting skills. In art, we will be drawing our own Greek vases using ideas from the myths we have learnt about so far.

Year 5 Weekly Information w/b 23.9.19

This week, we will be continuing to link our English work to our themed learning of 'Making the News'. We will be looking at and improving our understanding of recent discussions around the environment and climate change. The children will then use this topic to continue to develop their news report writing, including working on effective proofreading and editing,

In maths, we will be concluding our recent work on number. This week, we are going to refine our knowledge of ordering and comparing numbers and explore negative numbers. Towards the end of the week, the children are going to use their knowledge of number to produce some 'How to...' guides that can be referred to later in the year if they need a reminder.

Year 6 Weekly Information w/b 23.9.19

This week, the children will be presenting their Café Projects to each other, reflecting on how their team performed together and evaluating the work they produced.

In maths, we will be looking at place value and negative numbers and will also be comparing, rounding and ordering numbers, including decimals.

In English, we will be focusing on our speaking skills as part of the café project presentations and the house captain speeches. The children are not expected to learn their speeches but they should just use them as a prompt if possible. We will also be revising sentence structure and the correct use of capital letters, full stops and commas to extend sentences.

Now the reception children are all in school full-time, the Year 6 children will be carrying out their very responsible roles as buddies at lunch time play. There is a rota which the children have signed up to (if they wished to) to help support the reception children on the playground and/or read to a small group back in the classroom. We are sure they are all going to very caring buddies.

On Friday, the children will be performing their speeches to their houses in order for new House Captains to be voted in. The children should have all brought their speeches home to practise and we really appreciate your support with this.

In our MindUp lesson, we will be revising how learning about the parts of the brain helps us to understand our emotions. That it helps us to understand that we have a choice - we can change the way we respond in different situations and to different people. We can learn to notice how our brain is behaving and recognise the different emotions we are feeling. We can help our brain make better choices about the words we use and the way we act. We can learn to focus our brain on our learning.
