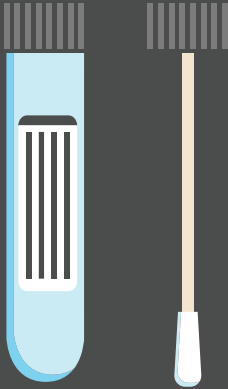


# COVID RATES ARE RISING IN YOUR AREA

## WITH SYMPTOMS - 'PCR' test



### WHEN TO TAKE THE TEST

- If you have Covid-19 symptoms
- To confirm your positive lateral flow test results

### HOW LONG IT TAKES

- These tests are processed in labs
- Up to 3 days, most results the next day

### GET A TEST

- At home • At a test site

## WITHOUT SYMPTOMS 'rapid lateral flow' test

### WHEN TO TAKE THE TEST

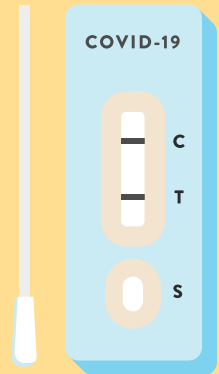
- If you do not have symptoms of Covid-19
- As part of routine testing twice a week

### HOW LONG IT TAKES

- Result processed by test device
- Around 30 minutes

### GET A TEST

- At home • At a test site • At work
- At your nursery • At your secondary school
- At your university • Order on line
- Collect from a pharmacy



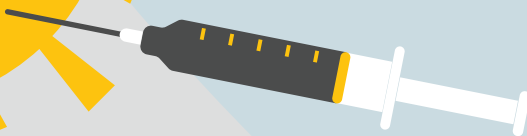
If you test positive you and your household must isolate. If you test positive with a lateral flow test, you must also book a confirmatory PCR test as soon as possible and **report your result to NHS test and trace**. - You're much less likely to be seriously ill with Covid-19, hospitalised or die if you've been vaccinated
- You need two doses for maximum protection for you and those around you
- It's important to keep your vaccination appointments for both doses when they are offered to you
- The vaccine reduces chances of hospitalisation by 85%
- As summer has arrived you may be mixing more with friends and family so make sure you take time to get vaccinated
