Dogs

This morning there were two dogs on the top field by the West Gate. Please note that pet dogs are not allowed on school premises including the top field. Parent Survey Feedback

When thinking about the range of subjects available in school, 95% of parent and carers agreed that we provided a good range of subjects to the children. Whilst state schools are bound to follow the National Curriculum, one of the subjects that we wanted to improve and raise the profile of with the children was music. This was echoed by comments in the survey from parents who would like the children to be taught music in greater depth.

In order to raise the profile of music, we knew it was vital for the children to be taught by a music specialist and so our search for a music teacher began! We were lucky enough to interview Mrs Rutherford and knew she would be perfect to inspire the children to learn and love music!

Mrs Rutherford will be teaching every class in the school as part of the PPA (Planning, Preparation and Assessment) time for the teachers. Already this term, the children have been introduced to her guitar and the school has been filled with the sound of singing, which has been amazing to hear after the COVID restrictions stopped us from singing last year! In addition to singing, the children have been using instruments in their lessons too. We are really looking forward to working closely with Mrs Rutherford to develop our music curriculum further and she already has a wish list of different instruments that she wants to introduce to the classes.

Learning to read is one of the most important things your child will learn at our school. Everything else depends on it, so we do all we can to make sure that every child learns to read quickly. We want your child to love reading – and want to read for themselves.

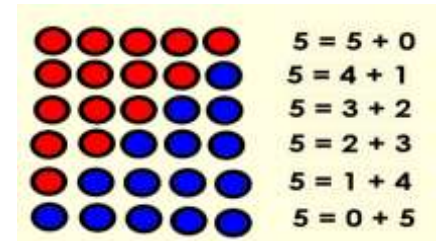
Year 1 Weekly Information w/b 4.10.21

The children demonstrated fantastic teamwork and communication skills during our outside learning last week. They performed some amazing puppet shows!

You'll have noticed in the 'Coming Up Soon' section of the Weekly Information that we are holding a workshop for Year 1 parents and carers which is all about Phonics and Reading. This hour-long session will focus on how we teach these skills here at Stamford Green. There have been some exciting changes this year, so even if you have an older child in the school there will be new information including about changes to the reading books and routines for children at home. We will also be sharing ideas to encourage children with their reading – and help them to develop a love of reading. In English, we are discussing what traditional means and the main features of traditional tales. Over the next 3 weeks, we will be reading Little Red Riding Hood, Jack and the Beanstalk, The Gingerbread Man, The Three Little Pigs and Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs. You may have your own copies of these at home that the children may like to share with you. We will be becoming familiar with these stories and encouraging the children to join in with the repetitive language. E.g. In the Three Little Pigs... "I will blow your house down!"

In maths, we are continuing to look at fact families. We are also working systemically to find number bonds within 10. Having a pattern or order to the way the children tackle these problems will really help. That is what we call 'working systematically'.



In science, we are continuing to look at evergreen and deciduous trees. We are going to be using our question frames to ask questions as we observe what we can see outside.

Also this week we are starting a 3-week art project. We will be choosing a character from a traditional tale that we have read. Firstly, we will be drawing and designing our character on paper thinking about the size and shapes we will need. In week 2, we will be using clay to create our traditional tale character and finally we will be painting them. It promises to be very exciting!

Year 2 Weekly Information w/b 4.10.21

In English this week, we will be continuing to write recounts. We will be using our plans from last week to write a recount of our recreation of the Great Fire of London focusing on using full stops, capital letters, descriptive language and using the past tense. Our spelling rule for this week is the /s/ sound spelled c before e, i and y.

In maths, we will be adding and subtracting numbers using concrete objects and pictorial representations and mentally. We will be including adding one-digit and two-digit numbers to 20, including zero. We will also be adding multiples of ten using our knowledge of number bonds.

Coming up soon in speedy maths (* indicates new learning):

w/b 4.10.21	*Know pairs of 10s to 100 Calculate 2-digit subtract 1-digit at speed Know number bonds to 10 and 20 at speed Know '2 less' at speed Know ½ of even numbers to 20
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w/b 11.10.21	*Add 10 to 2-digit numbers at speed Know pairs of 10s to 100 Add 1-digit numbers to 2-digit numbers at speed Know number bonds to 20 Count on in 5s Subtract 1 digit numbers from 2-digits at speed
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In science this week, we will be continuing to look at fair testing. We will be changing one variable e.g. size of beaker, amount of water etc. to determine whether this changes the results and which one causes the most change during a process.

In history, we will be investigating how the Great Fire of London was eventually stopped and the equipment that was used. We will be discussing how effective it was and comparing it to modern firefighting techniques.

In PSHER we will be identifying and discussing ways in which we can stay safe on line and identify what we should do if we feel worried or scare while online.

In geography we will be using atlases to locate countries and their capitals in the UK and transferring this onto a map.

In art over the next few weeks, we will be exploring patterns and textures through doing rubbings and printing. By next Monday, please could you send into school any objects you have at home which are textured for us to use eg leaves, cotton reels, corrugated card, scourer, fabric, string etc. Many thanks for your support with this.

Year 3 Weekly Information w/b 4.10.21

This week in English, we will recap punctuating direct speech accurately. We will also be using different synonyms for the word 'said' to make our writing more interesting. Later in the week, we will be looking at the features of different types of poetry.

These are the spelling words for this week. We would appreciate it if you could please help your child to practise them at home.

In maths this week, we will be learning to add and subtract multiples to 100. We will be beginning our topic of addition and subtraction and focusing on adding and subtracting ones from up to three digits. We will begin by not crossing the tens boundary (459-6) and then we will cross the boundary (53-9).

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In our wider curriculum, this week, we are very excited that the Dino Dome will be visiting us. We will be combining our science and D.T. skills by making fossils using the 'mould and cast' method. In PSHER we will be discussing how friendships can have ups and downs. In R.E. we will be discussing how Christians believe that the person of Jesus reveals what God is like. This week we will be focusing on the parable of the Good Samaritan. In geography we will be learning about Pangea and how Earth has changed over time.

Homework this week will be a My Maths activity on mental addition and subtraction.

Year 4 Weekly Information w/b 4.10.21

In English, we will be looking at Greek Myths. We will remind ourselves about the features of Greek Myths by comparing and contrasting some examples. We will then move on to planning our own Greek Myth. We will try to reflect recent aspects of writing we have been looking at, such as establishing setting to engage the reader. We will also look at the editing process and try to improve our work afterwards by eliminating clumsy language.

In maths, we will coming to the end of our learning about place value. We will look at how a knowledge of counting in 25s can help calculate to large numbers at speed. Later in the week we will explore negative numbers and Roman numerals.

Year 5 Weekly Information w/b 4.10.21

In English, we are looking closely at more recent news articles. We will be reading, editing and writing articles about climate change. Our class reader, *The Boy at the Back of the Class*, is proving to be an enthralling read – we are about half way through the story of Ahmet and his new classmates and we can't wait for each new chapter.

The children will be having a spelling quiz on Friday on these words:

Might be new:	Communicate Correspondence Dictionary

In maths, we will be revisiting written methods for column addition and subtraction ensuring the children have a secure understanding of exchange and place value. We will be exploring visual representations and dienes to cement our understanding.

Our speedy maths will be:

w.b: 4.10.21	Add and subtract pairs of 2-digit numbers at speed. Know pairs of numbers to 100. Use tables to work out related x and \div at speed. Continue simple number patterns
w.b: 11.10.21	Give change from £1 at speed Know pairs of tens to 180 Add three tens at speed. Convert cm to mm and vice versa

In science, we will be comparing and grouping different materials. We will be securing our understanding of the scientific vocabulary such as: magnetic, reflective, absorbent, permeable,

translucent, flexible, hard, flammable, insulating.

In PSHER, we will be discussing who Marcus Rashford is and the positive impact he has had in ensuring all children have access to food. In history, we will be looking at significant figures and events within the children's lifetime such as Jamie Oliver, and his impact towards improving school dinners. In geography, we will be looking at a world map and where significant earthquakes have taken place. In RE we will be looking at the views of Christians versus those who are not religious.

In DT, we will be introducing pizza making. The children will be researching toppings for a pizza they will be making in school next week. Your child will write in their Learning Journal by Friday of this week, what they will need to bring in.

Year 6 Weekly Information w/b 4.10.21

At the start of this week in English, we will be rehearsing and delivering our House Captain speeches. Later in the week, we will be researching and revising our knowledge of biographies. This will help us in the near future, when we will be creating biographies for famous figures from the American Civil Rights Movement.

This week's spelling quiz words (for this Friday's quiz):

In maths, we will be solving multiplication calculations that involve numbers with 4-digits and 2-digits. We will then be turning our attention to division and will work on problems that can be solved with short division, including calculations with remainders. We will also consider how factor pairs can help us to solve division questions.

Coming up soon in speedy maths:

w/b: 4.10.21	Know square roots to $\sqrt{144}$ (i.e. for tables). Know pairs of numbers to 100. Know all tables to 12x12 including division facts at speed. Know pairs of numbers to 180. Know common equivalent fractions, decimals and percentages. Know square numbers to 122.
w/b: 11.10.21	Add and subtract pairs of 2-digit numbers at speed. Convert m to km and vice versa. Know pairs of numbers to 90. Know common equivalent fractions, decimals and percentages. Add and subtract 2-digit and 3-digit numbers at speed. Continue simple number patterns.

In music, we will be looking at the social and cultural context of lyrics. We'll be investigating lyrics of different songs and trying to understand what the writer was trying to convey. In PSHER, we are continuing to develop our knowledge of mindfulness by revising mindful seeing and the role of the Reticular Activating System (RAS). In science we will be testing our knowledge of electricity and circuits with a quiz – this will help us identify any areas we might need to recap.

It's finally 6C's turn for Bikeability this week. We know they've been looking forward to it! Also the postponed Class Open Time for 6C will now take place on **Thursday 14 October** after school.

Would you like to be considered to be Head Boy or Head Girl?
