Introduction

We have welcomed the Government's announcement to continue the Sport Premium Grant. The DoE vision for the Primary PE and Sports Premium is:

All pupils leaving primary school physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy, active lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.

At Stamford Green we are committed to using this resource to develop high quality PE lessons, alongside greater opportunities for sporting competitions and clubs for all our young people.

What does the Sport Premium mean for my School?

'The premium must be used to fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport, to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles' (DfE October 2015).

4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
5. Increased participation in competitive sport
